Animal Kingdom Blanket

Thank you for purchasing the Animal Kingdom Blanket pack!
In this pack you can find details of all the patterns required to create this blanket.

In the pattern notes below you can find a full list of all the colours I used, however you can use any selection of colours you wish. I will also detail the colours used for each individual square on each pattern page throughout this pack.

Each square is made individually, before joining together with a continuous flat braid join, before adding the border.

My original Animal Kingdom Blanket is made up of 30 squares, each measuring approximately 14.5cm x 14.5cm, making the entire blanket with border included 84cm x 100cm (approximately 33 inches x 39 inches), (give-or-take a little depending on your tension).

Of course you can make your blanket larger or smaller by making more of your favourite squares, or eliminating some - consider it like a pick and mix!



Pattern Notes

For the main colours on the squares and the join and border, I used the following shades of Stylecraft Special DK (I used no more than one 100g ball unless otherwise stated):

- Copper
- Cypress
- Duck Egg
- Gold
- Grape
- Meadow
- Mushroom
- Mustard
- Parchment (**approximately 1.5 balls**) (for the join and border)
- Pistachio
- Storm Blue

And to create the appliqués I used the following shades of Stylecraft Special DK (again, no more than one 100g ball unless otherwise stated - many just a very small amount):

- Black
- Buttermilk
- Camel
- Cream
- Mocha
- Spice
- Vintage Peach
- Walnut
- Warm Grey
- White
- Along with some excess Copper, Meadow and Mustard.

I made the entire blanket using a 3.5mm crochet hook. You will also need scissors and a darning/sewing needle.

This pattern is written using US terminology.

Any stitch abbreviations used are listed on each individual squares pattern.

Due to the different stitches used, you may find that your finished squares slightly differ in size. Don't worry about this as once joined they will all be pulled evenly to shape and appear more uniform. However, you can of course block your squares before joining if you prefer.

Badger Face Appliqué



Hook size: 3.5mm

Stylecraft Special DK colours used:

- White
- Black
- Warm Grey

Stitch abbreviations (US Terminology):

CH - Chain

SLST - Slip Stitch

SC - Single Crochet

HDC - Half Double Crochet

DC - Double Crochet

[] indicates stitches to be done in the same space/stitch

1. Using **White**; CH3 and SLST into first CH to make a loop. CH1, then work 6SC into centre of loop. SLST to first SC to join.
2. CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. Proceed to work [2SC] into each of the next 5 stitches. SLST to first SC.
3. CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. *SC, [2SC]* - repeat between * until you have one stitch remaining. SC. SLST into first SC.
4. CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. *2SC, [2SC]* - repeat between * until you have two stitches remaining. 2SC. SLST into first SC.
5. CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. *3SC, [2SC]* - repeat between * until you have three stitches remaining. 3SC. SLST into first SC.
6. CH1, SC into same stitch. 2SC, 2HDC, [3DC], 3DC, [3DC], 5HDC, [3DC], 5HDC, [3DC], 3DC, [3DC], 2HDC, 2SC. SLST to first SC. Fasten off, leaving a long enough tail for sewing your completed appliqué onto it's square. (Note: where you have fastened off is the top of your badger's face.)
7. To make the markings: Using **Black**; CH2, [2SC] in 2nd CH from hook.
8. CH1, turn your work. SC into same stitch. SC.
9. CH1, turn your work. SC into same stitch. [2SC].
10. CH1, turn your work. SC into same stitch. 2SC.
11. Repeat row 10.
12. CH1, turn your work. SC into same stitch. [2SC], SC.
13. CH1, turn your work. SC into same stitch. 3SC.
14. Repeat row 13. Then fasten off, leaving a long enough tail for sewing.
15. Repeat steps 7 - 14 to create a second marking piece, then position these onto your badger's face, as you can see in the photo above, and sew into place.
16. To make the nose: Using **Black**; CH3 and SLST into first CH to make a loop. CH1, then work 6SC into centre of loop. SLST to first SC to join. Fasten off, leaving a long enough tail for sewing.
17. Position the nose onto the tip of your badger's face, as you can see in the photo above, and sew into place.
18. Using **Warm Grey**; embroider a pair of eyes onto your badger's face, as you can see in the photo above.

Badger Face Appliqué (continued)

19. To make the ears: Using **White**; CH3 and SLST into first CH to make a loop. CH1, then work 6SC into centre of loop. SLST to first SC to join. Fasten off.
20. Attach **Black** to any stitch; CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. Proceed to work [2SC] into each of the next 5 stitches. SLST to first SC. Fasten off, leaving a long enough tail for sewing.
21. Repeat steps 19 - 20 to make a second ear, then position these at the top of your badger, as you can see in the photo above, and sew into place on the reverse.

22. Your Badger Face Appliqué is now finished ✓

Bear Face Appliqué



Hook size: 3.5mm

Stylecraft Special DK colours used:

- Walnut
- Camel
- Black

Stitch abbreviations (US Terminology):

CH - Chain

SLST - Slip Stitch

SC - Single Crochet

HDC - Half Double Crochet

DC - Double Crochet

[] indicates stitches to be done in the same space/stitch

1. Using **Walnut**; CH3 and SLST into first CH to make a loop. CH1, then work 6SC into centre of loop. SLST to first SC to join.
2. CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. Proceed to work [2SC] into each of the next 5 stitches. SLST to first SC.
3. CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. *SC, [2SC]* - repeat between * until you have one stitch remaining. SC. SLST into first SC.
4. CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. *2SC, [2SC]* - repeat between * until you have two stitches remaining. 2SC. SLST into first SC.
5. CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. *3SC, [2SC]* - repeat between * until you have three stitches remaining. 3SC. SLST into first SC.
6. CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. *4SC, [2SC]* - repeat between * until you have four stitches remaining. 4SC. SLST into first SC.
7. CH1, SC into same stitch. 2SC, HDC, DC, [3DC], [2DC], 2DC, 2HDC, 4SC, 2HDC, [2HDC], 2HDC, 4SC, 2HDC, 2DC, [2DC], [3DC], DC, HDC, 4SC. SLST to first SC. Fasten off, leaving a long enough tail for sewing your completed appliqué onto it's square. (Note: where you have fastened off is the bottom of your bear's face.)
8. To make the ears: Using **Camel**; CH3 and SLST into first CH to make a loop. CH1, then work 6SC into centre of loop. SLST to first SC to join.
9. CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. Proceed to work [2SC] into each of the next 5 stitches. SLST to first SC. Fasten off.
10. Attach **Walnut** to any stitch; CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. *SC, [2SC]* - repeat between * until you have one stitch remaining. SC. SLST into first SC.
11. Repeat steps 8 - 10 to make a second ear, then position these at each side of your bear, as you can see in the photo above, and sew into place on the reverse.
12. To make the muzzle: Using **Camel**; CH3 and SLST into first CH to make a loop. CH1, then work 6SC into centre of loop. SLST to first SC to join.
13. CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. Proceed to work [2SC] into each of the next 5 stitches. SLST to first SC.
14. CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. *SC, [2SC]* - repeat between * until you have one stitch remaining. SC. SLST into first SC. Fasten off, leaving a long enough tail for sewing.
15. Using **Black**; embroider a nose onto your bear's muzzle. Then position this onto your bear appliqué, as you can see in the photo, and sew into place.
16. Using **Black**; embroider a pair of eyes onto your bear appliqué.
17. Your Bear Face Appliqué is now finished ✓

Bull Face Appliqué



Hook size: 3.5mm

Stylecraft Special DK colours used:

- Walnut
- Cream
- Mocha
- Black

Stitch abbreviations (US Terminology):

CH - Chain

SLST - Slip Stitch

SC - Single Crochet

HDC - Half Double Crochet

DC - Double Crochet

SC2TOG - Single Crochet Decrease Across 2 Stitches

HDC2TOG - Half Double Crochet Decrease Across 2 Stitches

[] indicates stitches to be done in the same space/stitch

1. Using **Walnut**; CH3 and SLST into first CH to make a loop. CH1, then work 6SC into centre of loop. SLST to first SC to join.
2. CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. Proceed to work [2SC] into each of the next 5 stitches. SLST to first SC.
3. CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. *SC, [2SC]* - repeat between * until you have one stitch remaining. SC. SLST into first SC.
4. CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. *2SC, [2SC]* - repeat between * until you have two stitches remaining. 2SC. SLST into first SC.
5. CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. 2HDC, DC, [2DC], DC, 2HDC, [2SC], 3SC, 3HDC. [2DC] into each of the next 3 stitches. 3HDC, 3SC. SLST into first SC.
6. CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. 2HDC, [2HDC], 4HDC, [2HDC], 2HDC, [2SC], [3HDC], 6SC, HDC, [3HDC], [3HDC], HDC, 6SC, [3HDC]. SLST to first SC. Fasten off. (Note: where you have fastened off is the top of your bull's face.)
7. To make the right horn: Using **Cream**; CH9, SLST into 2nd CH from hook. 2SC, SC2TOG, HDC2TOG, DC. Fasten off, leaving a long enough tail for sewing.
8. To make the left horn: Using **Cream**; CH7, SLST into 2nd CH from hook. 2SC, [2SC], [2HDC], DC. Fasten off, leaving a long enough tail for sewing.
9. Position the horns at each side of your bull's face, as you can see in the photo above, and sew into place on the reverse.
10. To make the ears: Using **Walnut**; CH4, SC in 2nd CH from hook. SC. [4HDC] in final CH to turn the corner. Working into the other side of your starting CH; 2SC. Fasten off, leaving a long enough tail for sewing.
11. Repeat step 10 to make a second ear, then position these at each side of your bull, just below the horns, and sew into place on the reverse.
12. To make the muzzle: Using **Mocha**; CH5, SC in 2nd CH from hook. 2SC. [4SC] in final CH to turn the corner. Working into the other side of your starting CH; 2SC. [3SC] into final, then SLST to first SC to join.
13. CH1, SC into same stitch. SLST into each of the next 2 stitches. SC. [2SC] into each of the next 2 stitches. SC, 2HDC, SC. [2SC] into each of the next 2 stitches. SLST to first SC to join. Fasten off, leaving a long enough tail for sewing.
14. Using **Black**; embroider a pair of eyes and nostrils onto your bull, as you can see in the photo above.

Bull Face Appliqué (continued)

15. To make the fluffy top: Using **Walnut**; CH7, SC in 2nd CH from hook. 4SC. [4SC] in final CH to turn the corner. Working into the other side of your starting CH; 4SC. [3SC] into final, then SLST to first SC to join.
16. CH1, [3HDC] into same stitch. SLST into next stitch. *[3HDC] into next stitch, SLST into next* - repeat between * 6 more times. SLST to first HDC to join. Fasten off, leaving a long enough tail for sewing.
17. Position this at the top of your bull's head, as you can see in the photo above, and sew into place.
18. Your Bull Face Appliqué is now finished ✓

Cheetah Face Appliqué



Hook size: 3.5mm

Stylecraft Special DK colours used:

- Buttermilk
- White
- Black

Stitch abbreviations (US Terminology):

CH - Chain

SLST - Slip Stitch

SC - Single Crochet

HDC - Half Double Crochet

[] indicates stitches to be done in the same space/stitch

1. Using **Buttermilk**; CH3 and SLST into first CH to make a loop. CH1, then work 6SC into centre of loop. SLST to first SC to join.
2. CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. Proceed to work [2SC] into each of the next 5 stitches. SLST to first SC.
3. CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. *SC, [2SC]* - repeat between * until you have one stitch remaining. SC. SLST into first SC.
4. CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. *2SC, [2SC]* - repeat between * until you have two stitches remaining. 2SC. SLST into first SC.
5. CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. *3SC, [2SC]* - repeat between * until you have three stitches remaining. 3SC. SLST into first SC.
6. CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. *4SC, [2SC]* - repeat between * until you have four stitches remaining. 4SC. SLST into first SC.
7. CH1, SC into same stitch. Proceed to work 1 SC into each stitch around. SLST to first SC. Fasten off, leaving a long enough tail for sewing your completed appliqué onto it's square.
8. To make the muzzle: Using **White**; CH3 and SLST into first CH to make a loop. CH1, then work 6SC into centre of loop. SLST to first SC to join.
9. CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. Proceed to work [2SC] into each of the next 5 stitches. SLST to first SC. Fasten off.
10. Attach **Black** to the BACK LOOP ONLY of any stitch; CH1, SLST into the BACK LOOPS ONLY of each of the next 3 stitches, then fasten off.
11. Skip the next 2 stitches and attach **Black** to the BACK LOOP ONLY of the next; CH1, SLST into the BACK LOOPS ONLY of each of the next 3 stitches. Fasten off, leaving a long enough tail for embroidering and sewing.
12. Using the **Black** tail remaining from the previous step; embroider a nose onto your cheetah's muzzle. Then position this piece onto your cheetah's face, as you can see in the photo above, and sew into place. Continue to embroider a pair of eyes and markings onto your cheetah, as you can see in the photo above.
13. To make the ears: Using **Black**; CH5, SC in 2nd CH from hook. 2SC. [4SC] in final CH to turn the corner. Working into the other side of your starting CH; 2SC. [3SC] into final, then SLST to first SC to join. Fasten off.
14. Attach **Buttermilk** to the same stitch from where you just fastened off; CH1, HDC into same stitch. 2HDC, SC. [2SC] into each of the next 2 stitches. SC, 3HDC. Omit the remaining stitches and fasten off, leaving a long enough tail for sewing.
15. Repeat steps 13 - 14 to make a second ear, then position these at each side of your cheetah, as you can see in the photo above, and sew into place on the reverse.
16. Your Cheetah Face Appliqué is now finished ✓

Deer Face Appliqué



Hook size: 3.5mm

Stylecraft Special DK colours used:

- Camel
- Cream
- Mocha
- Black

Stitch abbreviations (US Terminology):

CH - Chain

SC - Single Crochet

HDC - Half Double Crochet

DC - Double Crochet

SLST - Slip Stitch

[] indicates stitches to be done in the same space/stitch

1. Using **Camel**; CH2, [2SC] in 2nd CH from hook.
2. CH1, turn your work. SC into same stitch. SC.
- 3 - 5. Repeat row 2.
6. CH1, turn your work. [2SC] into same stitch. [2SC].
7. CH1, turn your work. SC into same stitch. [2SC], [2SC], SC.
8. CH1, turn your work. SC into same stitch. [2SC], 2SC, [2SC], SC.
9. CH1, turn your work. SC into same stitch. 7SC.
10. Repeat row 9.
11. CH1, turn your work. [3SC] into same stitch. [2SC], 4SC, [2SC], [3SC].
12. CH1, turn your work. HDC into same stitch. 12DC, HDC. Fasten off, leaving a long enough tail for sewing.
13. Using **Cream**; CH3 and SLST into first CH to make a loop. CH1, then work 6SC into centre of loop. SLST to first SC to join.
14. CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. Proceed to work [2SC] into each of the next 5 stitches. SLST to first SC.
15. CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. *SC, [2SC]* - repeat between * until you have one stitch remaining. SC. SLST into first SC.
16. CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. *2SC, [2SC]* - repeat between * until you have two stitches remaining. 2SC. SLST into first SC.
17. CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. *3SC, [2SC]* - repeat between * until you have three stitches remaining. 3SC. SLST into first SC.
18. CH1, SC into same stitch. 2SC, 2HDC, [3DC], 3DC, [3DC], 5HDC, [3DC], 5HDC, [3DC], 3DC, [3DC], 2HDC, 2SC. SLST to first SC. Fasten off, leaving a long enough tail for sewing your completed appliqué onto it's square. (Note: where you have fastened off is the top of your deer's face.)
19. Position your first piece on top of your second piece, as you can see in the photo above, and sew into place.
20. To make the nose: Using **Black**; CH3 and SLST into first CH to make a loop. CH1, then work 6SC into centre of loop. SLST to first SC to join. Fasten off, leaving a long enough tail for sewing.
21. Position the nose onto the tip of your deer's face, as you can see in the photo above, and sew into place.
22. Using **Black**; embroider a pair of eyes onto your deer's face.

Deer Face Appliqué (continued)

23. To make the ears: Using **Cream**; CH3 and SLST into first CH to make a loop. CH1, then work 6SC into centre of loop. SLST to first SC to join. Fasten off.
24. Attach **Camel** to any stitch; CH1, SC into same stitch. 2SC, CH3 and SLST into 3rd CH from hook, 2SC, [2SC]. SLST to first SC to join. Fasten off, leaving a long enough tail for sewing.
25. Repeat steps 23 - 24 to make a second ear, then position these at each side of your deer, as you can see in the photo above, and sew into place on the reverse.

26. To make the antlers: Using **Mocha**; CH15, SLST in 2nd CH from hook. SLST into each of the next 4 CH. CH7, SLST into 2nd CH from hook. SLST into each of the next 5 CH, then SLST into the next CH of your original starting CH. SLST into each of the next 2 CH. CH6, SLST into 2nd CH from hook. SLST into each of the next 4 CH, then SLST into the next CH of your original starting CH. SLST into each of the final 5 CH. Fasten off, leaving a long enough tail for sewing.
27. Repeat step 26 to make a second antler, then position these at the top of your deer, as you can see in the photo above, and sew into place.

28. Your Deer Face Appliqué is now finished ✓

Donkey Face Appliqué



Hook size: 3.5mm

Stylecraft Special DK colours used:

- Warm Grey
- Camel
- Black

Stitch abbreviations (US Terminology):

CH - Chain

SLST - Slip Stitch

SC - Single Crochet

HDC - Half Double Crochet

DC - Double Crochet

[] indicates stitches to be done in the same space/stitch

1. Using **Warm Grey**; CH3 and SLST into first CH to make a loop. CH1, then work 6SC into centre of loop. SLST to first SC to join.
2. CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. Proceed to work [2SC] into each of the next 5 stitches. SLST to first SC.
3. CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. *SC, [2SC]* - repeat between * until you have one stitch remaining. SC. SLST into first SC.
4. CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. *2SC, [2SC]* - repeat between * until you have two stitches remaining. 2SC. SLST into first SC.
5. CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. *3SC, [2SC]* - repeat between * until you have three stitches remaining. 3SC. SLST into first SC.
6. CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. *4SC, [2SC]* - repeat between * once more. HDC, 3DC, [2DC], 3DC, HDC, [2SC]. Repeat between * once more. 4SC. SLST to first SC.
7. CH1, SC into same stitch. Proceed to work 1 SC into each stitch around. SLST to first SC to join. Fasten off, leaving a long enough tail for sewing your completed appliqué onto it's square. (Note: where you have fastened off is the top of your donkey's face.)
8. To make the muzzle: Using **Camel**; CH3 and SLST into first CH to make a loop. CH1, then work 6SC into centre of loop. SLST to first SC to join.
9. CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. Proceed to work [2SC] into each of the next 5 stitches. SLST to first SC.
10. CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. *SC, [2SC]* - repeat between * until you have one stitch remaining. SC. SLST into first SC.
11. CH1, SC into same stitch. 4SC, [2HDC], 2DC, [2HDC], 4SC, [2HDC], 2DC, [2HDC], SC. SLST to first SC. Fasten off, leaving a long enough tail for sewing.
12. Position the muzzle piece onto your donkey appliqué, as you can see in the photo above, and sew into place.
13. Using **Black**; embroider a pair of eyes and nostrils onto your donkey, as you can see in the photo above.
14. To make the fringe: Using **Black**; CH14, SLST into 2nd CH from hook. SLST into each of the next 3 CH. *CH5, SLST into 2nd CH from hook. SLST into each of the next 3 CH, then SLST into the next CH from your starting CH, SLST into next CH* - repeat between * twice more. SLST into each of the final 3 CH. Fasten off, leaving a long enough tail for sewing.
15. Position this at the top of your donkey's face, as you can see in the photo above, and sew into place.

Donkey Face Appliqué (continued)

16. To make the ears: Using **Camel**; CH6, SC in 2nd CH from hook. 3SC. [3SC] in final CH to turn the corner. Working into the other side of your starting CH; 4SC. Fasten off.
17. Attach **Warm Grey** to very first stitch; CH1, SC into same stitch. 2SC, 2HDC, [3DC], 2HDC, 3SC. SLST to first stitch to pinch the ends together. Fasten off, leaving a long enough tail for sewing.
18. Repeat steps 16 - 17 to make a second ear, then position these at each side of your donkey, as you can see in the photo above, and sew into place on the reverse.
19. Your Donkey Face Appliqué is now finished ✓

Elephant Face Appliqué



Hook size: 3.5mm

Stylecraft Special DK colours used:

- Warm Grey
- Vintage Peach
- Black

Stitch abbreviations (US Terminology):

CH - Chain

SLST - Slip Stitch

SC - Single Crochet

HDC - Half Double Crochet

DC - Double Crochet

HDC2TOG - Half Double Crochet Decrease Across 2 Stitches

TR - Treble Crochet

[] indicates stitches to be done in the same space/stitch

1. Using **Warm Grey**; CH3 and SLST into first CH to make a loop. CH1, then work 6SC into centre of loop. SLST to first SC to join.
2. CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. Proceed to work [2SC] into each of the next 5 stitches. SLST to first SC.
3. CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. *SC, [2SC]* - repeat between * until you have one stitch remaining. SC. SLST into first SC.
4. CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. *2SC, [2SC]* - repeat between * until you have two stitches remaining. 2SC. SLST into first SC.
5. CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. *3SC, [2SC]* - repeat between * until you have three stitches remaining. 3SC. SLST into first SC.
6. CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. *4SC, [2SC]* - repeat between * until you have four stitches remaining. 4SC. SLST into first SC.
7. CH1, SC into same stitch. Proceed to work 1 SC into each stitch around. SLST to first SC. Fasten off, leaving a long enough tail for sewing your completed appliqué onto it's square. (Note: where you have fastened off is the bottom of your elephant's face.)
8. To make the ears: Using **Vintage Peach**; CH3 and SLST into first CH to make a loop. CH1, then work 6SC into centre of loop. SLST to first SC to join.
9. CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. Proceed to work [2SC] into each of the next 5 stitches. SLST to first SC.
10. CH1, [2HDC] into same stitch. HDC, [2SC], SC, [2SC], HDC, [2HDC], HDC, [2SC], SC, [2SC], HDC. SLST to first HDC.
11. CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. [2SC], 6SC. [2SC] into each of the next 3 stitches. 6SC, [2SC]. SLST to first SC to join. Fasten off.
12. Attach **Warm Grey** to the same stitch from where you just fastened off; CH2, DC into same stitch. 2DC, [2HDC], HDC, 4SC, HDC, [2HDC], 4DC, [2HDC], HDC, 4SC, HDC, [2HDC], DC. SLST to first DC to join. Fasten off, leaving a long enough tail for sewing.
13. Repeat steps 8 - 12 to make a second ear, then position these at each side of your elephant, as you can see in the photo above, and sew into place on the reverse.

Elephant Face Appliqué (continued)

14. To make the trunk: Using **Warm Grey**; CH15, HDC in 2nd CH from hook. HDC2TOG, HDC2TOG, HDC, 6DC, TR. [TR DC HDC SC SLST] all into final CH. Then fasten off, leaving a long enough tail for sewing.
15. Position this onto your elephant's face, as you can see in the photo above, and sew into place.
16. Using **Black**; embroider a pair of eyes onto your elephant appliqué.
17. Your Elephant Face Appliqué is now finished ✓

Fox Face Appliqué



Hook size: 3.5mm

13. To make the nose: Using **Black**; CH4, SC in 2nd CH from hook. SC. [4SC] into final CH to turn corner. Working into the other side of your starting CH; SC, [3SC]. SLST to first SC to join.
14. CH1, SC into same stitch. HDC, [HDC DC], 2HDC, [DC HDC], HDC, SC, [SC HDC], [HDC SC]. SLST to first SC. Fasten off, leaving a long enough tail for sewing.
15. Position the nose onto your koala, as you can see in the photo above, and sew into place.
16. Using **Black**; embroider a pair of eyes onto your koala appliqué.
17. Your Koala Face Appliqué is now finished ✓

3. CH1, [2HDC] into same stitch. [2HDC], 6HDC. [2HDC] into each of the next 7 stitches. 2DC, 2TR, 2DC. [2HDC] into each of the next 5 stitches. SLST to first HDC.
4. CH1, SC into same stitch. 17SC, 5HDC, 3DC, 2TR, 3DC, 5HDC, 4SC. SLST to first SC to join. Fasten off.
5. Attach **Warm Grey** to the same stitch from where you just fastened off; CH1 (counts as first SLST), SC into next stitch. SC, 2HDC, 5DC, 2HDC, 2SC. SLST into next stitch. Fasten off, leaving a long enough tail for sewing your completed appliqué onto it's square.
6. To make the eyes: Using **Buttermilk**; CH3 and SLST into first CH to make a loop. CH1, then work 6SC into centre of loop. SLST to first SC to join.

12. CH1, [2SC] into same stitch. *4SC, [2SC]* - repeat between * once more. 4SC. Skip the next 2 stitches and work [7DC] into the next. Skip the next stitch and SLST into the next. Skip the next stitch and work [7DC] into the next. SLST to first SC to join. Fasten off, leaving a long enough tail for sewing.
13. Position this piece onto your first, as you can see in the photo above, and sew into place.
14. To make the beak: Using **Mustard**; CH5, SC in 2nd CH from hook. 3SC.
15. CH1, turn your work. SC2TOG, SC2TOG.
16. CH1, turn your work. SC2TOG. Fasten off, leaving a long enough tail for sewing.
17. Position this onto your penguin, as you can see in the photo above, and sew into place.
18. Using **Black**; embroider a pair of eyes onto your penguin's face, as you can see in the photo above.

9. Attach **Warm Grey** to the very first stitch; CH1, SC into same stitch. 9SC, [HDC 2DC HDC], 10SC. Fasten off, leaving a long enough tail for sewing.
10. Repeat steps 8 - 9 to make a second ear, then position these at the top of your rabbit, as you can see in the photo above, and sew into place on the reverse.
11. To make the muzzle: Using **White**; CH5, SC in 2nd CH from hook. 2SC. [4SC] in final CH to turn the corner. Working into the other side of your starting CH; 2SC. [3SC] into final, then SLST to first SC to join.
12. CH1, SC into same stitch. 2HDC, SC, [2SC]. [7DC] into next stitch, then skip the next stitch and SLST into next. SLST into next stitch. Skip the next stitch and work [7DC] into the next, then [2SC] into the next. SLST to first SC to join. Fasten off, leaving a long enough tail for sewing.
13. Using **Vintage Peach**; embroider a nose onto your rabbit's muzzle. Then position this onto your rabbit appliqué, as you can see in the photo, and sew into place.
14. Using **Black**; embroider a pair of eyes onto your rabbit appliqué.



[CH3 2DC] into corner space. *3DC in between each of the 3DC clusters from the previous round, working [3DC CH2 3DC] into each corner space* - repeat between * until you arrive back at your beginning corner space, work 3DC into that corner space. CH2, and SLST to 3rd CH of beginning CH3.
- 4 - 7. Repeat row 3.
8. Turn your work, SLST into corner space. CH1 (does NOT count as a stitch), SC into corner space. Proceed to work 1 SC into each stitch around with [SC CH2 SC] in each CH2 corner space. When you return to your beginning corner space work another SC into the corner, then CH2 and SLST to first SC to join.
9. Turn your work, SLST into corner space. CH1 (does NOT count as a stitch), HDC into corner space. { HDC. *HDC. Instead of working into the top of the next stitch; work a FPTR around the centre DC of the 3DC cluster of round 7 directly below. HDC into next stitch* - repeat between * 6 more times. HDC. [HDC CH2 HDC] into corner space } - repeat between { } for each side, omitting the last [HDC CH2 HDC] on final repeat. Instead work another HDC into your beginning corner space, then CH2 and SLST to first HDC to join.
10. Do NOT turn your work. CH1 (does NOT count as a stitch), work 1 SC into each stitch around with [SC CH2 SC] in each CH2 corner space. SLST to first SC to join. Fasten off, then secure and weave in your ends. You should have 27 stitches on each side, plus 2CH in each corner.

Background Square B



Hook size: 3.5mm

Stitch abbreviations (US Terminology):

CH - Chain

SLST - Slip Stitch

DC - Double Crochet

SC - Single Crochet

BBL - Bobble Stitch

[] indicates stitches to be done in the same space/stitch




Make one square in each of the following shades of Stylecraft Special DK:

- Copper
- Cypress
- Duck Egg
- Gold
- Grape
- Meadow
- Mushroom
- Mustard
- Pistachio
- Storm Blue

To create a bobble; yarn over, insert hook into space, pull through, yarn over and pull through 2 stitches, repeat 3 more times so you end up with 5 loops on your hook. Yarn over and pull through all loops on your hook.

1. CH3 and SLST into first CH to make a loop. CH3, work 2 DC into centre. *CH2, 3 DC into centre* - repeat between * twice more. CH2, SLST into 3rd CH of beginning CH3 to join.
2. Turn your work, SLST into corner space. CH3 (counts as first stitch), DC into corner space. *DC into each stitch across, [2DC CH2 2DC] into corner space* - repeat between * until you are back round to the beginning, working 2 DC into the corner space. Then CH2 and SLST to 3rd chain of beginning CH3 to join.
- 3 - 5. Repeat round 2.
6. Turn your work, SLST into corner space. CH1 (does NOT count as a stitch), SC into corner space. { SC, *BBL, 3SC* - repeat between * until you have 2 stitches remaining on this side. BBL, SC. [SC CH2 SC] into corner space } - repeat between { } for each side, omitting the last [SC CH2 SC] on final repeat. Instead work another SC into your beginning corner space, then CH2 and SLST to first SC to join.
7. Turn your work, SLST into corner space. CH1 (does NOT count as a stitch), SC into corner space. *SC into each stitch across, [SC CH2 SC] into corner space* - repeat between * for each side, omitting the last [SC CH2 SC] on final repeat. Instead work another SC into your beginning corner space, then CH2 and SLST to first SC to join.
8. Repeat round 6.
9. Turn your work, SLST into corner space. CH1 (does NOT count as a stitch), SC into corner space. Proceed to work 1 SC into each stitch around with [SC CH2 SC] in each CH2 corner space. When you return to your beginning corner space work another SC into the corner, then CH2 and SLST to first SC to join. Fasten off, then secure and weave in your ends. You should have 27 stitches on each side, plus 2CH in each corner.

Background Square C



Hook size: 3.5mm



Make one square in each of the following shades of Stylecraft Special DK:

- Copper

- Grape

- Storm Blue

1. CH3 and SLST into first CH to make a loop. CH3, work 2 DC into centre. *CH2, 3 DC into centre* - repeat between * twice more. CH2, SLST into 3rd CH of beginning CH3 to join.
2. Turn your work, SLST into corner space. CH3 (counts as first stitch), DC into corner space. *DC into each stitch across, [2DC CH2 2DC] into corner space* - repeat between * until you are back round to the beginning, working 2 DC into the corner space. Then CH2 and SLST to 3rd chain of beginning CH3 to join.
- 3 - 6. Repeat round 2.
7. Turn your work, SLST into corner space. CH1 (does NOT count as a stitch), HDC into corner space. { 2HDC. Instead of working into the top of the next stitch; work a FPTR around the first stitch of round 5. HDC into next stitch. Instead of working into the top of the next stitch again; work another FPTR around the first stitch of round 5. HDC into next stitch. 3HDC, FPDC, HDC. Instead of working into the top of the next stitch; work a FPTR around the 10th stitch of round 5. HDC into next stitch. FPDC, 4HDC. Instead of working into the top of the next stitch; work a FPTR around the last stitch of round 5. HDC into next stitch. Instead of working into the top of the next stitch again; work another FPTR around the last stitch of round 5. HDC into next stitch. HDC. [HDC CH2 HDC] into corner space } - repeat between { } for each side, omitting the last [HDC CH2 HDC] on final repeat. Instead work another HDC into your beginning corner space, then CH2 and SLST to first HDC to join.
8. DO NOT turn your work. CH1 (does NOT count as a stitch), work 1 SC into each stitch around with [SC CH2 SC] in each CH2 corner space. SLST to first SC to join. Fasten off, then secure and weave in your ends. You should have 27 stitches on each side, plus 2CH in each corner.

ANIMAL KINGDOM BLANKET

COMPLETE PATTERN (PART 5)



Assembling

When you have completed all 30 of your animal face appliqués and 30 squares, you can begin to sew your appliqués onto their squares. To do this you will need a darning/sewing needle, and your scissors to cut the excess yarn after securing and weaving in your ends.

Position each of your appliqués onto their relevant squares, as detailed below (or switch them around if you prefer) - you can pin your appliqués into place if you feel that this would make it easier when sewing.

Gazelle: Square A in Copper

Badger: Square C in Meadow

Zebra: Square B in Pistachio

Koala: Square C in Storm Blue

Monkey: Square A in Mustard

Owl: Square C in Mushroom

Tiger: Square B in Storm Blue

Lion: Square C in Duck Egg

Bear: Square A in Mushroom

Cheetah: Square B in Gold

Penguin: Square B in Duck Egg

Donkey: Square C in Mustard

Deer: Square A in Grape

Giraffe: Square B in Meadow

Frog: Square C in Copper

Sloth: Square C in Pistachio

Wild Boar: Square B in Cypress

Elephant: Square A in Gold

Panda: Square C in Cypress

Hedgehog: Square A in Pistachio

Wolf: Square B in Grape

Hippo: Square A in Storm Blue

Bull: Square B in Mustard

Lemur: Square A in Duck Egg

Llama: Square B in Mushroom

Mouse: Square C in Gold

Rhino: Square B in Copper

Goat: Square A in Cypress

Rabbit: Square C in Grape


Fox: Square A in Meadow




Using the remaining tail on each appliqué, sew the appliqués onto their squares being careful only to go through the fronts of the stitches on the square and the backs of the stitches on the appliqué so that the stitch-work doesn't show through.

Secure and weave in remaining ends, and your Animal Kingdom Blanket squares are finished ✓

Joining



The method used to join the squares for the Animal Kingdom Blanket is a continuous flat braid join. First, arrange your squares into the order that they will be joined - when working the join squares are attached from the top right in reverse rows, as shown:



Hook size: 3.5mm

Yarn: Stylecraft Special DK in Parchment

Stitch abbreviations (US Terminology):

CH - Chain

SC - Single Crochet

SLST - Slip Stitch

Note: As stated in the pattern notes, you may find that your finished squares differ in size slightly. If you prefer to block your squares before joining then this will help to even up the sizes of the squares a little, however the flat braid join is very forgiving and helps to pull the squares evenly into a similar size and shape when joined.



- Starting with Square 1 (Mustard Square A with Monkey Appliqué), join **Parchment** to the first stitch after the CH2 corner at the top right of the square, CH4. *skip the next stitch, SC into the next stitch (3rd stitch along the square), CH3* - repeat between * until you reach the end of the first side, SC in the final stitch before the CH2 corner. You should have 13 CH loops across the side of the square (this will be the same on each side of every square). CH5, skip the CH2 corner and create a SC in the first stitch after the CH2 corner. *CH3, skip a stitch and create a SC in the next stitch* - repeat between * until you finish with a SC in the final stitch on this side.
- CH5, on Square 2 (Storm Blue Square C with Koala Appliqué) create a SC in the first stitch after the bottom right CH2 corner (working UP the right hand side of the square), *CH1, remove your hook, insert your hook under the last CH3 loop you made on Square 1, grab the working loop you just removed your hook from, and pull through, CH2, skip a stitch on Square 2, SC in the next stitch* - repeat between * until you have worked through all 13 loops up the side of the square.
- CH3, remove your hook, insert your hook under the CH5 loop on the corner of Square 1, grab the working yarn loop and pull it through, CH3, SC in the first stitch after the CH2 corner on top of Square 2. CH3, repeat from row 1 (from first asterisk (*)).

Joining (continued)

4. When you come to the end of your first row of squares, continue down the side of the final square of the row (Copper Square A with Gazelle Appliqué), turn your work and then continue along the bottom of the square. When you come to the last stitch on the square; CH3, remove your hook, insert your hook under the CH5 loop, grab the working yarn loop and pull it through, CH3, SC in the first stitch after the CH2 corner on the next square. Continue with the CH3, skip a stitch, SC pattern across - whenever you come to the last stitch on a square, working CH3, removing your hook, inserting under the CH5 loop, grabbing and pulling through the working yarn loop, CH3, SC into the first stitch after the CH2 corner, and continuing..... until you reach the end of the bottom side of the first square.
5. CH5, create a SC in the first stitch after the CH2 on Square 6 (Gold Square B with Cheetah Appliqué), *CH1, remove your hook, insert your hook under the first CH3 loop of Square 1, grab the working yarn loop and pull it through, CH2, skip a stitch, SC in the next stitch* - repeat between * for the next 12 loops.
6. After completing the final CH3 loop; CH3, remove your hook, insert your hook under the CH5 loop at the bottom corner of Square 2, grab the working yarn loop and pull it through the CH5 loop, CH3, SC in the first stitch after the CH2 down the side of Square 6 (diagonally from the corner of Square 2 where you just joined). Repeat the same method here as the first row of squares; CH3, skip a stitch, SC in the next stitch... CH5 at the bottom and work your way up the next square (Square 7 - Mushroom Square A with Bear Appliqué).
7. After completing the final CH3 loop; CH3, remove your hook, insert your hook under the CH5 loop on the bottom left corner of Square 1, grab the working yarn loop and pull it through, CH3, SC in the first stitch after the CH2 corner of Square 7 - this connects the corners of the squares diagonally, making a pretty symmetrical shape consisting of 4 loops.
8. Continue to join your squares in the same way that you have this far, repeating the above methods for the rest of your squares. When you reach the final stitch along the bottom of your final row of squares; CH5, skip the CH2 corner space, SC in the first stitch after the CH2 corner, and continue up the side in the same way as you worked along the bottom of your rows of squares. When you have created your final SC in the very last stitch; CH5, SLST to the first CH of the beginning CH4. DON'T fasten off - you will be continuing from here into the border.



Border



Hook size: 3.5mm

Yarn: Stylecraft Special DK in Parchment

Stitch abbreviations (US Terminology):

SLST - Slip Stitch

CH - Chain

DC - Double Crochet

HDC - Half Double Crochet

[] indicates stitches to be done in the same space/stitch

1. Continuing from Joining (using **Parchment**); SLST into CH3 loop space. CH3 (counts as first stitch), DC into same space. Continue to make 2DC into each CH3 loop space around, with [2DC CH2 2DC] into each CH5 corner loop space. When you have gotten all the way around; SLST to 3rd CH of beginning CH3 to join.
2. CH2 (counts as first stitch), HDC into the BACK LOOP ONLY of the next stitch. Proceed to work 1 HDC into the BACK LOOP ONLY of each stitch around, with [2HDC CH2 2HDC] in each CH2 corner space. SLST to first HDC to join.
3. CH1 (counts as first SLST), turn your work so that the wrong side is facing you. *DC into next stitch, SLST into next* - repeat between * around, working [SLST DC SLST] in each CH2 corner space. After working your final DC, SLST to beginning CH1 stitch. Fasten off, weave in your ends...

... And your Animal Kingdom Blanket is now finished!
