Crochet Patterns

The Boho Bunny



Introduction:

Thank you for purchasing this pattern! If you have any questions at all while making this lovey, please do not hesitate to message me to ask for help.

I encourage you to get creative when using my patterns. This little bunny would look great with any combo of Super Bulky yarn & amigurumi eyes.

I hope you enjoy my pattern; I appreciate you and your support!

Note: Parts of this pattern are worked in rounds, so I find it helpful to use a stitch marker when making the head and ears.

Materials:

- **Yarn:**
I used two skeins [Wool-Ease® Thick & Quick® Yarn](#) in the color “Fisherman” but feel free to use any Super Bulky (6) yarn that you desire! Also, you will need a small amount of yarn in the color and weight of your choice for the nose embroidery. (I used Yarn Bee Soft & Sleek Chunky in the color “Linen”)
- **Hook Sizes:** J (6mm) for head & ears; [P \(11.5mm\)](#) for blanket portion.
- **Fiberfill:** For stuffing head.
- **Amigurumi Safety Eyes:** (15mm) – this is optional if you prefer to embroider the eyes.
- **Stitch Marker**
- **Darning Needle** (for sewing)
- **Pom Maker:** I used size 6.8cm/2.7inch - optional
- **Scissors**

Boho Bunny Pattern

Abbreviations (US Terms:)

MC = Magic Circle	SC = Single Crochet	St(s) = Stitch(es)	DEC = Decrease (crochet two stitches together)
Sl St = Slip Stitch	HDC = Half Double Crochet	INC = Increase (Two stitches in one stitch)	CH = Chain

Head

The head is worked in continuous rounds, so you may choose to use a stitch marker at the start of each round.

With **6mm** hook; Start with a MC,

CH 1. (does not count as a ST)

Round 1: 6 SC into MC. Pull Circle Tight. (6)

Round 2: INC in each ST around. (12)

Round 3: (SC 1, INC) x 6 around. (18)

Round 4: (SC 2, INC) x 6 around. (24)

Round 5: (SC 3, INC) x 6 around. (30)

Round 6-8: SC 1 in each ST around. (30)

Round 9: (SC 4, INC) x 6 around. (36)

Round 10-12: SC 1 in each ST around. (36)

Place amigurumi eyes between rounds 8 & 9 about 7 stitches apart. You can also start stuffing the head here and keep adding stuffing as you continue along.

Round 13: (SC 4, DEC) x 6 around. (30)

Round 14: (SC 3, DEC) x 6 around. (24)

Round 15: (SC 2, DEC) x 6 around. (18)

Round 16: (SC 1, DEC) x 6 around. (12)

Round 17: DEC in each ST around. (6)

Fasten off & leave long tail; Sew opening shut by weaving tail in & out of remaining stitches with yarn needle. Keep tail long & move on to blanket portion.

Ear (Make Two)

The ears are worked in continuous rounds, so you may choose to use a stitch marker at the start of each round.

With **6mm** hook; Start with MC,

CH 1. (does not count as ST)

Round 1: 4 SC into MC. Pull Circle Tight. (4)

Round 2: INC in each ST around. (8)

Round 3: SC 1 in each ST around. (8)

Round 4: (SC 1, INC) x 4 around. (12)

Round 5: (SC 3, INC) x 3 around. (15)

Round 6: (SC 4, INC) x 3 around. (18)

Round 7-11: SC 1 in each ST around. (18)

Round 12: (SC 4, DEC) x 3 around. (15)

Round 13-17: SC 1 in each ST around. (15)

Round 18: (SC 3, DEC) x 3 around. (12)

Round 19-24: SC 1 in each ST around. (12)

Round 25: (SC 2, DEC) x 3 around. (9)

Round 26 & 27: SC 1 in each ST around. (9)

Press the top together & crochet 4 SC across (through both sides).

Fasten off & leave long tail for sewing.

Blanket

With 11.5mm hook

CH 21.

Row 1: Turn & HDC in second CH from hook & in each across, CH 1. (20)

Row 2-15: Repeat Row 1

Fast Off.

Poms

Make 4 (One for each corner of blanket)

Assembly

Attach ears to head between rounds 5 & 6 centered to back of head with about five stitches between them. See photos below.



Once ears are attached to the head.

Attach head to center four stitches of blanket by weaving long tail of head through the stitches and into the head over and over until you feel satisfied with your attachment.



Next, Attach one pom to each corner of the blanket. I like to do this by first tying tails of poms through a stitch at the corner; double knotting that tie, and then sewing in ends to blanket.

Grab your contrasting nose color & needle. Your last step is to embroider the nose onto the head. I like to bring the yarn from the "chin" area of the head (leaving some excess hanging out) and bring the yarn up and out between rounds 9 & 10 about 2 stitches from the right eye. I bring the yarn loosely straight across 3 stitches to the left and enter back into the head. I bring the yarn out at the center & one round down. I bring it over the yarn that is running across and stitch the yarn back into the head at the center 2 rounds below. Bring the yarn back out of the head at the same spot you started at the chin. Tie a knot with the beginning tail and end tail & sew ends into head.



Sew in & trim all ends.

You have completed your Boho Bunny!

& Just like you, it is unique & beautiful!
