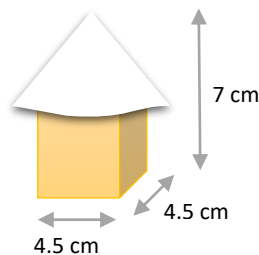


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ELENDAN DOLLHOUSE

Finished size: approx. 1.7" x 1.7" x 2.7"
(4.5 cm x 4.5 cm x 7 cm)



Terms & abbreviations:

Note! I use US terms. US single crochet = UK double crochet

approx. - approximately

ch - chain

sl st – slip stitch

sc – single crochet (in UK terminology – double crochet)

hdc – half double crochet

dc – double crochet (in UK terminology – treble crochet)

inc – increase

dec – decrease

Materials (for dollhouse)

(additional materials for accessories and bunny are given in their descriptions)

Note! You may choose thicker yarn and suitable hook to obtain house bigger, than mine.

Just remember, that crocheting must be tight, otherwise dollhouse won't be solid and straight.

Yarn A (beige) – for walls, floors and attic – approx. 30 g (100% cotton) 100g/200m (3.5 oz/218 yds) that matches yarn weight №2 – fine/DK yarn;

Yarn B (white) – for roof and ground – approx. 20 g (100% cotton) 100g/200m (3.5 oz/218 yds) that matches yarn weight №2 – fine/DK yarn;

Crochet hook – 1,75 mm (US steel/thread hook 4 or UK steel/thread hook 2);

Scissors;

Needle for yarn;

Button;

Floral tape (wire) approx. 40 cm;

Tape measure/ruler;

Round nose pliers – for making wire frame.

Part 1 FLOOR

Make 3 floor details.

Use yarn A (beige).

Row 1:

Make a foundation chain of 9 stitches.

Single crochet in second chain from hook, sc in each ch across row (8 sc)

Rows 2-4:

ch 1, turn, sc in each ch along row (8)

Try to hide the tail of yarn while crocheting.

Trim row:

ch 1, sc 4 evenly spaced along edge to corner;
2 sc into corner, 6 sc in each stitch,
2 sc into next corner, sc 4 evenly spaced from
edge to corner (18)

Fasten off and cut the yarn after having finished 2 details. After having made the 3-d detail DO NOT cut the yarn.



WALLS

Turn back the floor detail as you see on photo.

Row 1:

Ch 1, make 18 sc through back loop of last row *(after you turned the detail it's farther loop from you)* (18)



Section 1

Rows 2-4:

ch 1, turn, sc 2 (every sc in each sc of bottom row) (2)





Section 2

Row 2:

ch 4, skip 2 stitches of bottom walls row, inserting hook into 3-d stitch sc 10 (every sc in each sc of bottom row) (10)



Section 2

Row 3:

ch 1, turn, sc 9 (every sc in each sc of bottom row), sc 1 hitching up the loop of ch (*pull the yarn through the loop of chain when you finish making single crochet*) (10)





Section 2

Row 4:

sl st into the loop of ch, turn, sc 10 (every sc in each sc of bottom row) (10)



Section 3

Row 2:

ch 4, skip 2 stitches of bottom walls row,
inserting hook into 3-d stitch sc 2 (2)



Section 3

Row 3:

ch 1, turn, sc 1, sc 1 hitching up the loop of ch
(2)



Section 3

Row 4:

sl st into the loop of ch, turn, sc 2 (2)





Row 5 (along all sections):
ch 1, turn, sc 2 in each stitch, sc 2 into chain,
sc 10 in each stitch, sc 2 into chain, sc 2 in
each stitch (18)



Row 6:

Turn. Take 1 floor detail.

Ch 1, make 18 sc through back loop of walls
(after you turned the detail it's farther loop from you) and back loop of floor detail (18)



Row 7:

ch 1, turn, sc in each stitch of row (18)



Section 1

Rows 8-10:

ch 1, turn, sc 6 in each stitch of row (6)

Section 2

Row 8:

ch 4, skip 2 stitches of bottom walls row,
inserting hook into 3-d stitch sc 2 (2)

Row 9:

ch 1, turn, sc 1, sc 1 hitching up the loop of ch
(2)



Row 10:
sl st into the loop of ch, turn, sc 2 (2)

Section 3

Row 8:
ch 4, skip 2 stitches of bottom walls row,
inserting hook into 3-d stitch sc 6 (6)

Row 9:
ch 1, turn, sc 5, sc 1 hitching up the loop of ch
(6)

Row 10:
sl st into the loop of ch, turn, sc 6 (6)



Row 11 (along all sections):
ch 1, turn, sc 6 in each stitch, sc 2 into chain,
sc 2 in each stitch, sc 2 into chain, sc 6 in
each stitch (18)



Row 12:
Turn. Take 2-nd floor detail.
Ch 1, make 18 sc through back loop of walls
*(after you turned the detail, it's farther loop
from you)* and back loop of floor detail (18)

Don't fasten off! We'll start making attic
from this place.



ATTIC

Row 1:
ch 1, turn, 5 sl st, ch 1, sc 8 (8)



Row 2:
ch 1, turn, dec, sc 4, dec (6)

Row 3:
ch 1, turn, dec, sc 2, dec (4)

Row 4:
ch 1, turn, 2 dec (2)

Row 5:
ch 1, turn, dec (1), ch 1, 5 sl st down, 5 sl st
along the top of wall, as showed on photos.

Do not fasten off!





ROOF

I'll show how to make the roof connecting it with walls and attic while crocheting - I try to avoid sewing in my projects as much as I can, but you may just crochet equal detail and sew it to walls and attic.

Take yarn B (white).

Row 1:

Make a foundation chain of 7 stitches.
Sc in second chain from hook, sc in each ch along row (6). Try to hide the yarn tail while crocheting.

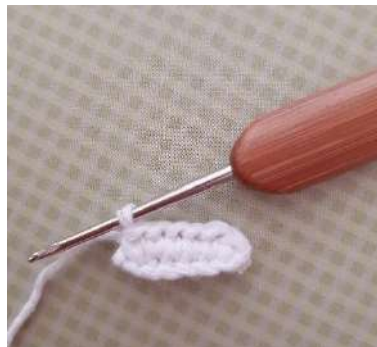
Row 2:

ch 1, sc 4 through last walls row and previous roof row together, sc 1 through last walls and roof rows hitching up the first attic row too as showed on photos, sc 1 (6)

Additional explanations:

“sc 4 through last walls row and previous roof row together” **means** that you need to insert hook into both details when you start making each of sc 4;

“sc 1 through last walls and roof rows hitching up the first attic row too” **means** you should first insert the hook into both roof and walls (as previous step), pull out the thread, then insert the hook into attic border, pull out the thread and crochet both loops on a hook together now.





Row 3:
ch 1, turn, sc 1, sc 1 hitching up the stitch of
attic, sc 4 (6)





Row 4:
ch 1, turn, sc 4, sc 1 hitching up stitch of attic,
sc 1 (6)



Row 5:
ch 1, turn, sc 1, sc 1 hitching up stitch of attic,
sc 4 (6)

Row 6:
ch 1, turn, sc 4, sc 1 hitching up stitch of attic,
sc 1 (6)

Row 7:
ch 1, turn, sc 1, sc 1 hitching up stitch of attic,
sc 4 (6)

Row 8:
ch 1, turn, sc 4, sc 1 hitching up stitch of attic,
sc 1 (6)

Row 9:
ch 1, turn, sc 1, sc 1 hitching up stitch of attic,
sc 4 (6)

Row 10:
ch 1, turn, sc 4, sc 1 hitching up stitch of attic,
sc 1 (6)

Row 11:
ch 1, turn, sc 1, sc 1 hitching up stitch of attic,
sc 4 (6)

Row 12:
ch 1, turn, sc 4, sc 1 hitching up stitch of attic,
sc 1 (6)





Row 13:
ch 1, turn, sc 1, sc 5 pulling the thread
through the stitches of last walls row (6)





Row 14:
ch 1, turn, sc 6 (6)

Row 15:
ch 1, turn, 6 sl st into previous row, ch 1, 2 sl
st along frontal roof border (*you should
appear close to place where you've finished
working with yarn A*), do not fasten off!





FRAME

I use floral tape for frame. Measure borders of house as showed. My total length is 19 cm (7,5"). Cut the wire of needed length + 0.5 cm (0,2"). I cut 19.5 cm (7,7"). Join the ends with round nose pliers as showed.



Insert hook in the loop of yarn A (beige) and crochet over frame as showed below. You have to make 1 ch, sc 6 along 2-nd floor, sc 6 along 1-st floor, sc 10 along floor into BACK loop, sc 6 along next side of 1-st floor, sc 6 along next side of 2-nd floor (34). Fasten off, cut the yarn.







Insert hook into loop of yarn B (white), sc 6 over frame before place of frame ends joining, sc 6 over frame after place of frame ends joining, 2 sl st along frontal roof border, ch 1, 6 sl st along left side of roof border. Fasten off, weave in all ends.





With needle and yarn hide the place of frame ends joining. Then sew decoration button if you wish.



Decorate with embroidery, if you wish. I start from bottom and at the end hide the tail under roof.



GROUND

Row 1. Work with yarn B. Inserting hook into front loops of FLOOR detail (*not frame!*) sc 28. (28)
Try to hide the tail while crocheting.



Row 2. Continue working in spiral rows. 1 inc, 8 sc, 2 inc, 2 sc, 2 inc, 8 sc, 2 inc, 2 sc, 1 inc. (36)



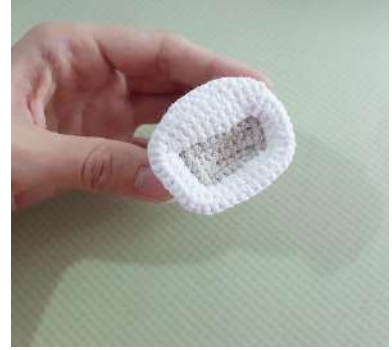
Row 3: 1 inc, 10 sc, 2 inc, 4 sc, 2 inc, 10 sc, 2 inc, 4 sc, 1 inc. (44)

Row 4: 1 inc, 2 sc, 1 hdc, 6 dc, 1 hdc, 2 sc, sl st. (14) Fasten off, weave in the end of yarn.



First part is ready! I give you some photos to check.





Part 2

FLOOR

Use yarn A (beige).

Row 1:

Make a foundation chain of 9 stitches.

Sc in second ch from hook, sc in each ch along row (8 sc)

Row 2:

ch 1, turn, sc 8 (8)

Try to hide the tail of yarn while crocheting.

Trim row:

ch 1, sc 2 evenly spaced along edge to corner;
2 sc into corner, 6 sc in each ch,
2 sc into next corner, sc 2 evenly spaced from
edge to corner (14)

Don't fasten off!

WALLS

Turn back the floor detail as you see on photo.

Row 1:

Make 14 sc through back loop (*after you turned the detail, it's farther loop from you*) (14)

Section 1

Rows 2-4:

ch 1, turn, sc 2 (2)



Section 2

Row 2:

ch 4, skip 2 stitches of bottom walls row, inserting hook into 3-d stitch sc 6 (every sc in each sc of bottom row) (6)

Row 3:

ch 1, turn, sc 5 (every sc in each sc of bottom row), sc hitching up the loop of ch (*pull the yarn through the loop of chain when you finish making single crochet*) (6)

Row 4:

sl st into the loop of ch, turn, sc 6 (6)



Section 3

Row 2:

ch 4, skip 2 stitches of bottom walls row, inserting hook into 3-d stitch sc 2 (2)

Row 3:

ch 1, turn, sc 1, sc 1 hitching up the loop of ch (2)

Row 4:

sl st into the loop of ch, turn, sc 2 (2)



Row 5 (along all sections):

ch 1, turn, sc 2 in each stitch, sc 2 into chain, sc 6 in each stitch, sc 2 into chain, sc 2 in each stitch (14)

Rows 6-7 (along all sections):

Turn, ch 1, sc 14 (14)



Section 1

Rows 8-10:

ch 1, turn, sc 4 in each stitch of row (4)

Section 2

Row 8:

ch 4, skip 2 stitches of bottom walls row, inserting hook into 3-d stitch sc 2 (2)

Row 9:

ch 1, turn, sc 1, sc hitching up the loop of ch (2)

Row 10:

sl st into the loop of ch, turn, sc 2 (2)

Section 3

Row 8:

ch 4, skip 2 stitches of bottom walls row, inserting hook into 3-d stitch sc 4 (4)

Row 9:

ch 1, turn, sc 3, sc 1 hitching up the loop of ch (4)

Row 10:

sl st into the loop of ch, turn, sc 4 (4)

Row 11 (along all sections):

ch 1, turn, sc 4 in each stitch, sc 2 into chain, sc 2 in each stitch, sc 2 into chain, sc 4 in each stitch (14)

Row 12 (along all sections):

Turn, ch 1, sc 14 (14)

Don't fasten off!

ATTIC

Row 1:

ch 1, turn, 3 sl st along last walls row, ch 1, sc 8 (8)

Row 2:

ch 1, turn, dec, sc 4, dec (6)

Row 3:

ch 1, turn, dec, sc 2, dec (4)

Row 4:

ch 1, turn, 2 dec (2)

Row 5:

ch 1, turn, dec (1), ch 1, 5 sl st down, 3 sl st along the top of wall, as showed on photos.

Do not fasten off!



ROOF

Take yarn B (white).

Row 1:

Make a foundation chain of 5 stitches.
Single crochet in second chain from hook, sc in each ch along row (4). Try to hide the yarn tail while crocheting.

Row 2:

ch 1, sc 2 through last walls row together with previous roof row, sc 1 through last walls and roof row hitching up first attic row too, sc 1 (4)

Row 3:

ch 1, turn, sc 1, sc 1 hitching up stitch of attic, sc 2 (4)

Row 4:

ch 1, turn, sc 2, sc 1 hitching up stitch of attic, sc 1 (4)

Row 5:

ch 1, turn, sc 1, sc 1 hitching up stitch of attic, sc 2 (4)

Row 6:

ch 1, turn, sc 2, sc 1 hitching up stitch of attic, sc 1 (4)

Row 7:

ch 1, turn, sc 1, sc 1 hitching up stitch of attic, sc 2 (4)

Row 8:

ch 1, turn, sc 2, sc 1 hitching up stitch of attic, sc 1 (4)

Row 9:

ch 1, turn, sc 1, sc 1 hitching up stitch of attic, sc 2 (4)

Row 10:

ch 1, turn, sc 2, sc 1 hitching up stitch of attic, sc 1 (4)

Row 11:

ch 1, turn, sc 1, sc 1 hitching up stitch of attic, sc 2 (4)

Row 12:

ch 1, turn, sc 2, sc 1 hitching up stitch of attic, sc 1 (4)

Row 13:

ch 1, turn, sc 1, sc 3 pulling the thread through the stitches of last walls row (4)

Row 14:

ch 1, turn, sc 4 (4)

Row 15:

ch 1, turn, 4 sl st into previous row, ch 1, 2 sl st along frontal roof border, do not fasten off!



FRAME

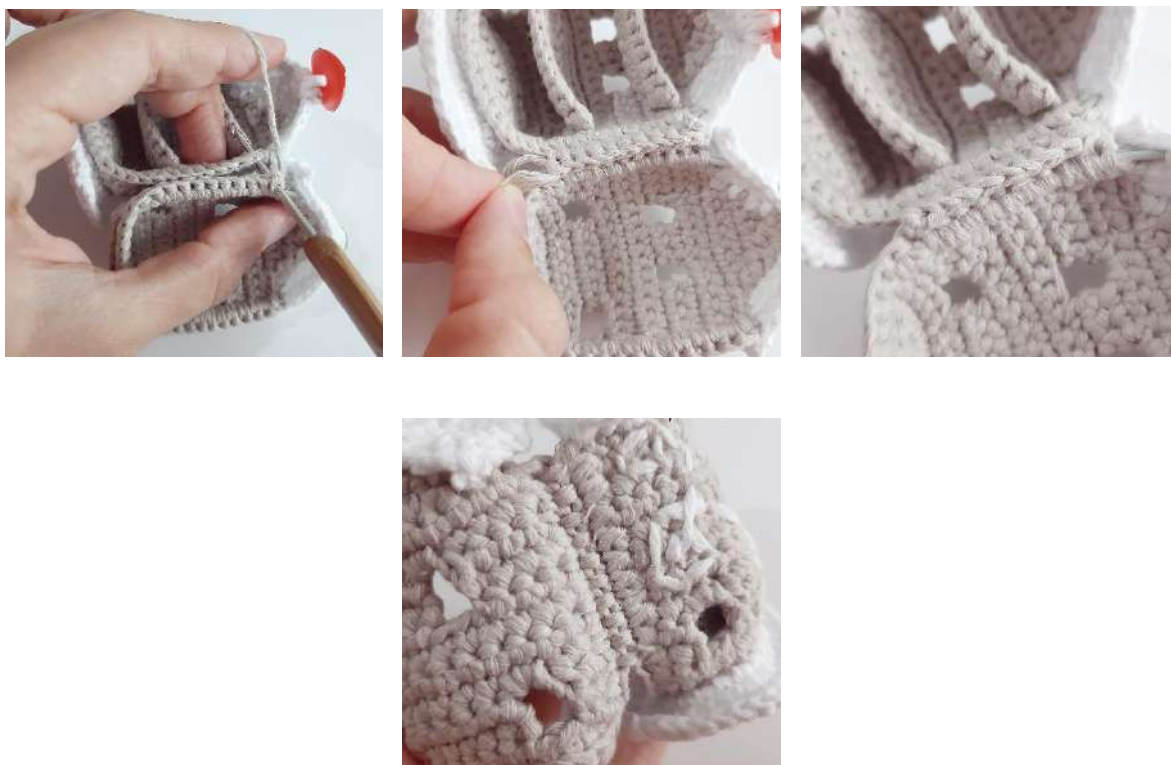
Measure borders of this part. My total length is 17 cm (6,7"). Cut the wire of corresponding length + 0.5 cm (0,2"). I cut 17,5 cm (7"). Join the ends with round nose pliers.

Insert hook into loop of yarn B (white), sc 6 over frame before point of frame ends joining, sc 6 over frame after place of joining, 2 sl st along roof border, ch 1, 4 sl st along left side roof border. Fasten off, weave in the end of yarn. (Detailed photos were shown at part 1.)

Insert hook in the loop of yarn A (beige) and crochet over frame. Make 1 ch, sc 6 along 2-nd floor, now we'll make a buttonhole loop. Make a chain – depending on size of your button. Diameter of my button is about 8 mm, so I made 9 ch, sl st into 1-st loop of ch. Sc 6 along 1-st floor, sc 10 along floor into back loop, sc 6 along next side of 1-st floor, sc 6 along next side of 2-nd floor. Do not fasten off!



Ch 1, sc 10 through borders of both parts, as showed. Fasten off, weave in the tail inside the row.



With needle and yarn hide the place of frame ends joining. Sew the button between 1 and 2 floors on the outer side of part 1.



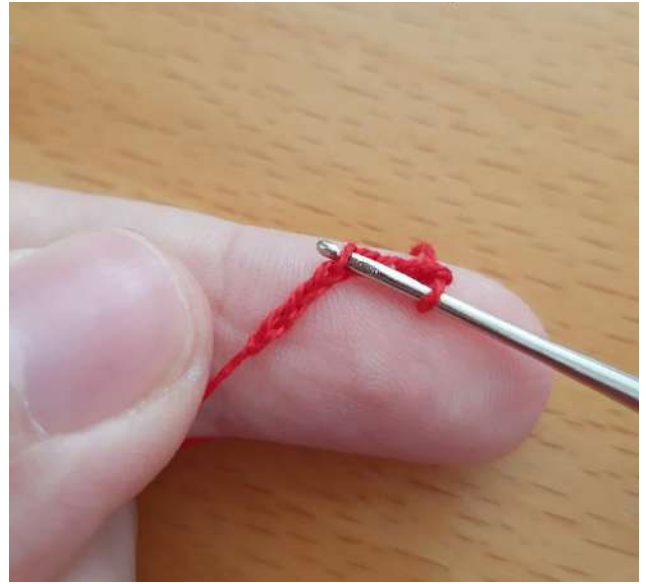
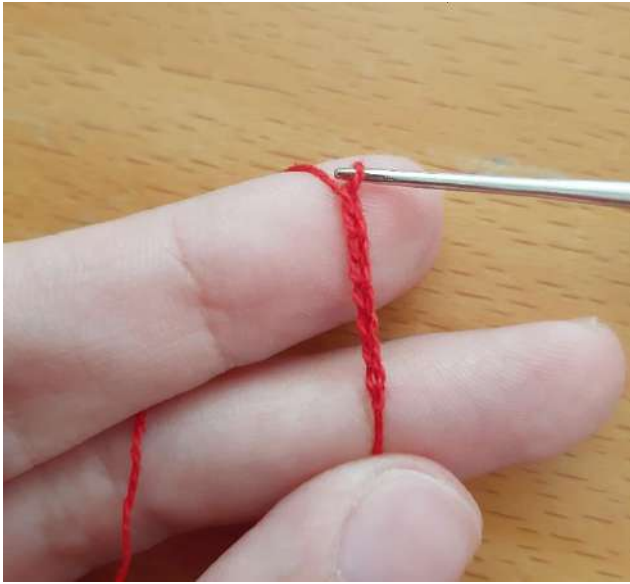
HOME DECOR

Garland

With hook 1.00 mm and thin yarn ch 8 (leaving long tail), sl st into 4-th ch from beginning.

[Ch 8, sl st into 4-th ch from previous part] x 4.

Ch 4. Fasten off leaving long tail. Join garland to the roof with hook or with needle outside of part 2 (or wherever you like).





Christmas tree

With hook 1.75 mm (*the same as used for house*) and green yarn (*identical to yarn used for house*) make foundation chain of 10 stitches, sl st into 1-st ch.

Work in spiral rows.

Rows 1-2: sc 10

Row 3: [dec, sc 3] x 2 (8)

Row 4: [dec, sc 2] x 2 (6)

Row 5: [dec, sc] x 2 (4)

Row 6: [sl st into opposite stitch from hook] x 2 (*this way I finish rows when it's hard to continue making decreases*)

Fasten off, hide the tail, sew decor and embroider if you wish.

Take white yarn. Work along foundation chain: ch 1, [inc, sc] x 5 (15). Fasten off, hide the tail.





Blanket

I like to make it in tunisian technique, but there's no big difference, so crochet as you are able to. Here I give description of common way of crocheting.

With hook 1.75 mm and corresponding yarn ch 9, beginning from 2-nd ch from hook sc 8.

[Ch 1, turn, sc 8] x 5 rows.

You'll receive a rectangle 6 rows X 8 stitches. Fasten off, weave in the ends.

Pillow

Use the same hook and yarn. Ch 5, beginning from 2-nd ch from hook sc 4.

[Ch 1, turn, sc 4] x 5 rows.

You'll receive a rectangle 6 rows X 4 stitches. Fasten off. Fold it, make slip stitches along 3 sides of borders or join them with a needle. Hide the tails inside.

That's how it looks when made in tunisian crochet technique.



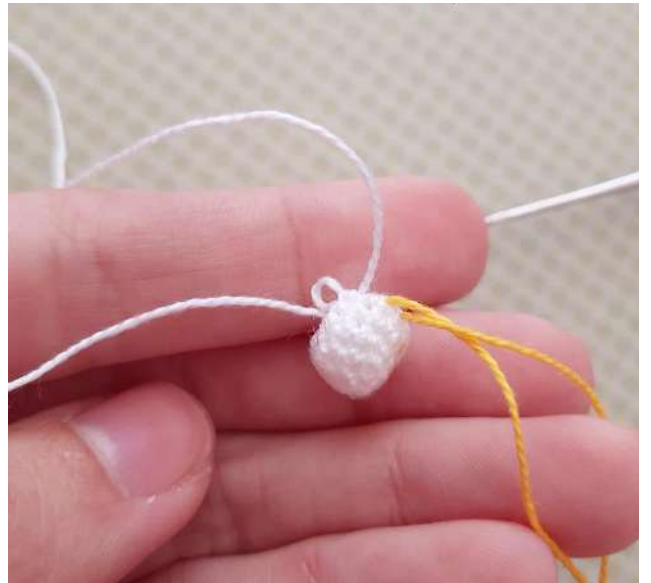
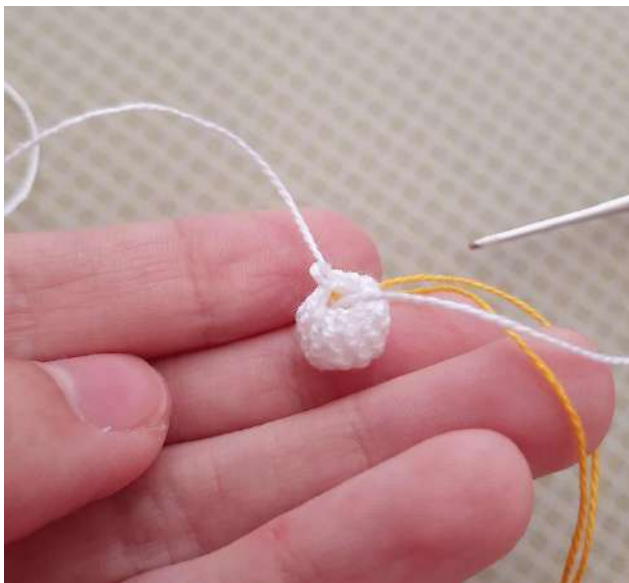
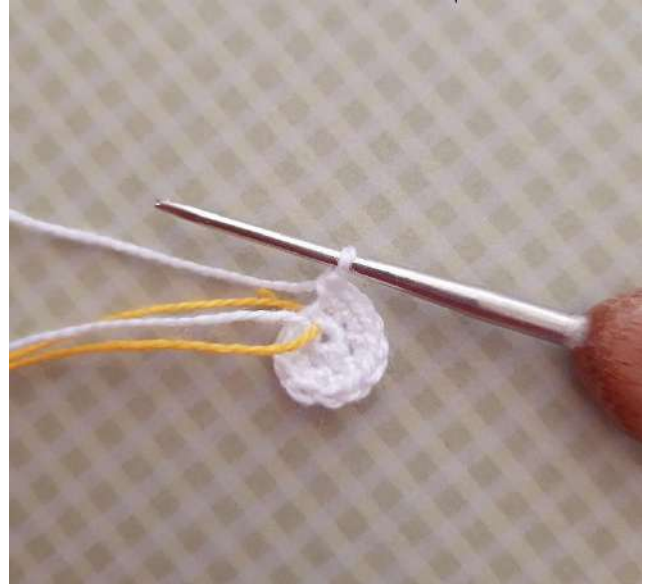
ELENDAN MICRO BUNNY

Hook 1.0 mm, yarn 650 m/100 g (or thinner). Work in spiral rows. Use thread in contrast color to mark the rows.

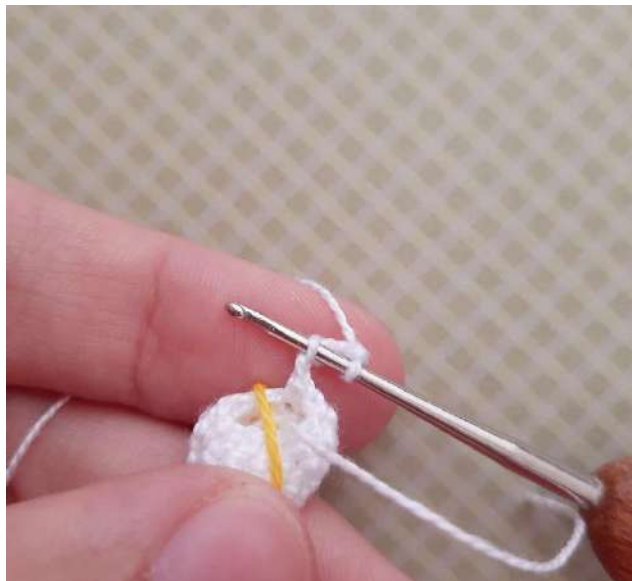
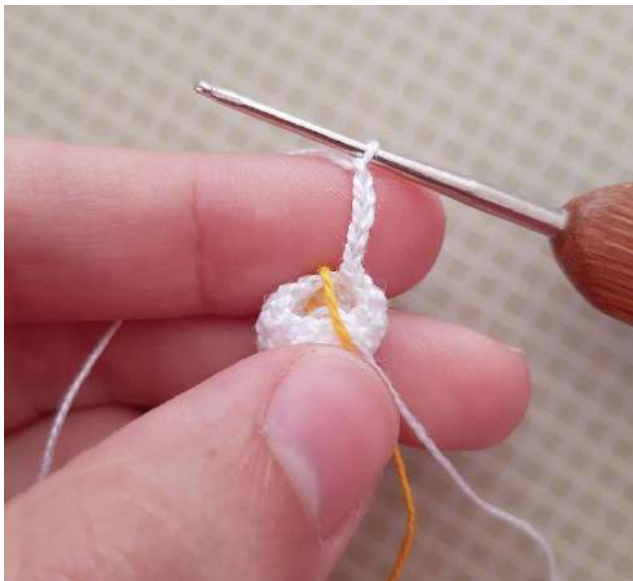
Row 1: 6 sc in magic ring (or as you usually begin spiral rows crocheting) (6);

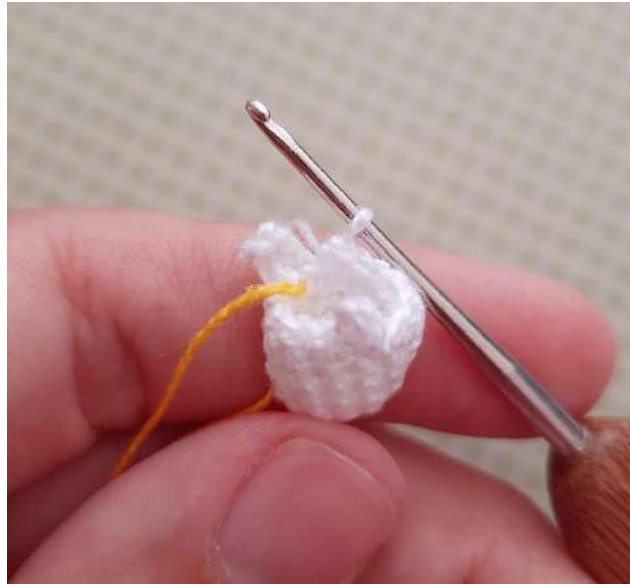
Row 2: 6 inc (12);

Rows 3-6: sc into each stitch (12);



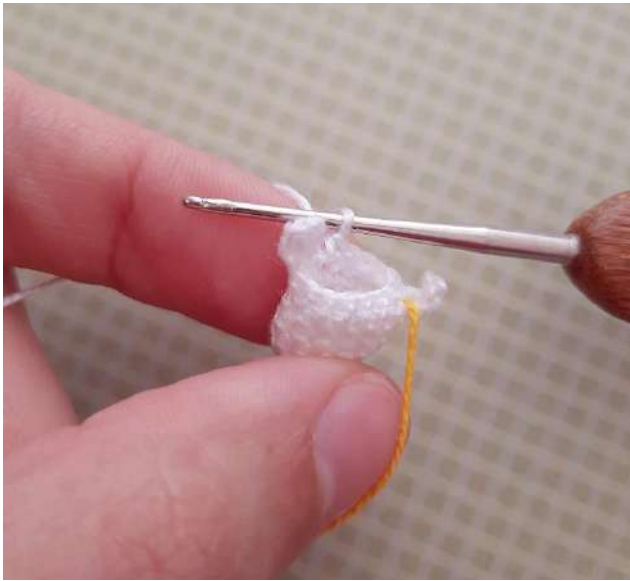
Row 7: We make arms in this row. Make 5 ch, beginning from 2-nd ch from body sc 2. One arm is ready, continue crocheting along the body – sc 5. Make second arm: ch 5, beginning from 2-nd ch from body sc 2. Return to row of body - sc 7. (12) Just follow my photos to see how it goes.





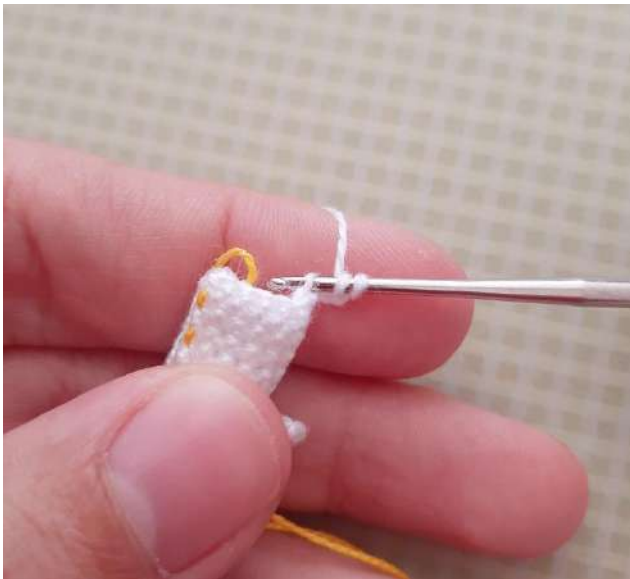
Row 8: skip the arms and crochet as usually – each sc into each sc of previous row. Make 12 sc. (12) Follow my photos.

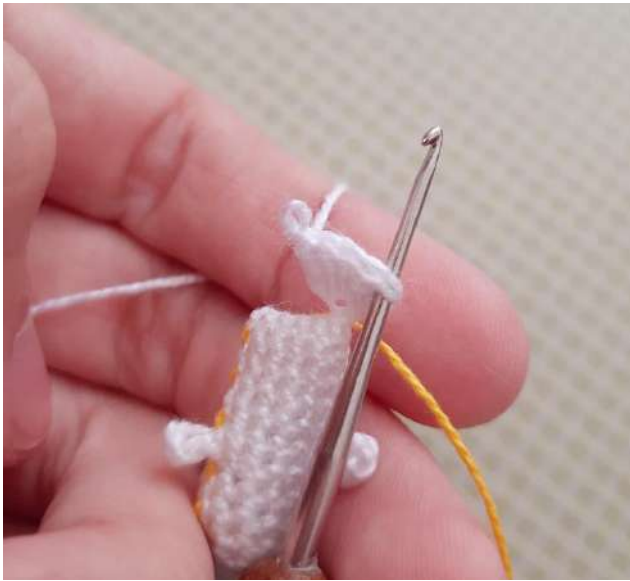


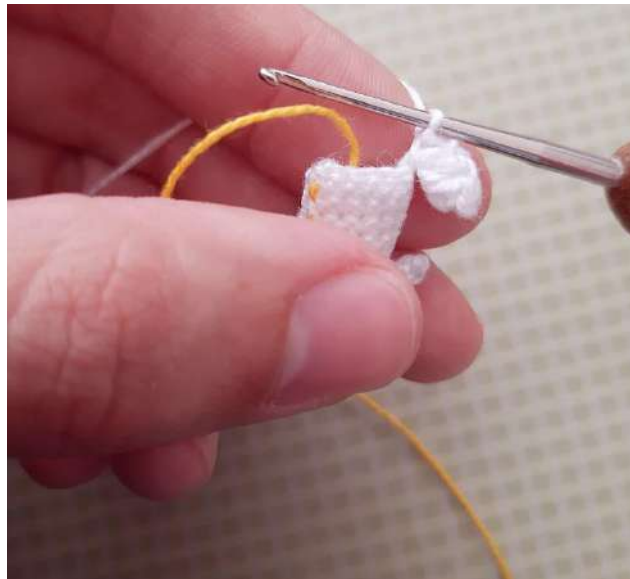
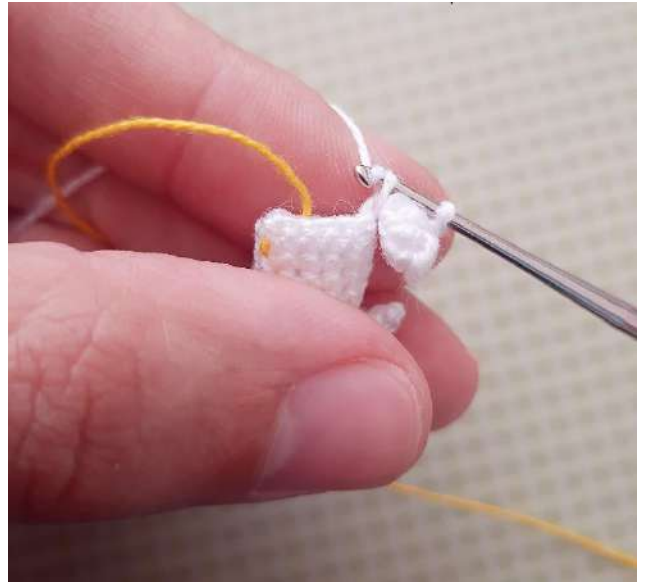
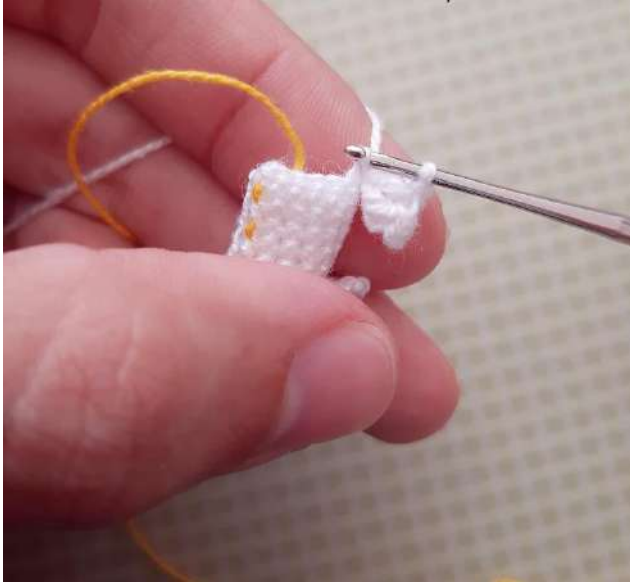


Rows 9-12: sc into each stitch (12). Insert a bit of toys filler inside (not much!)

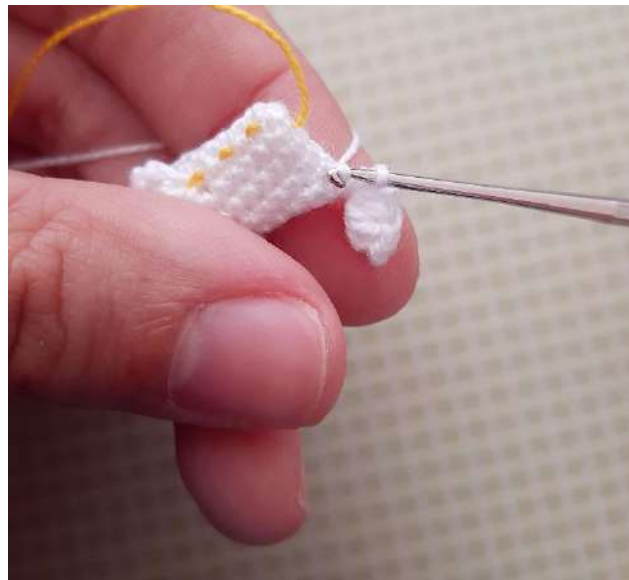
Row 13: sc 6, make a leg now. Ch 3, inserting hook into 3-d ch from hook make popcorn stitch: 5 dc in one chain, join the first and the last dc with slip stitch. Make 2 chains. Put hook behind the popcorn stitch. Pulling yarn from behind make a loop (*thus you tighten the base of popcorn stitch*), crochet 2 loops on your hook together.







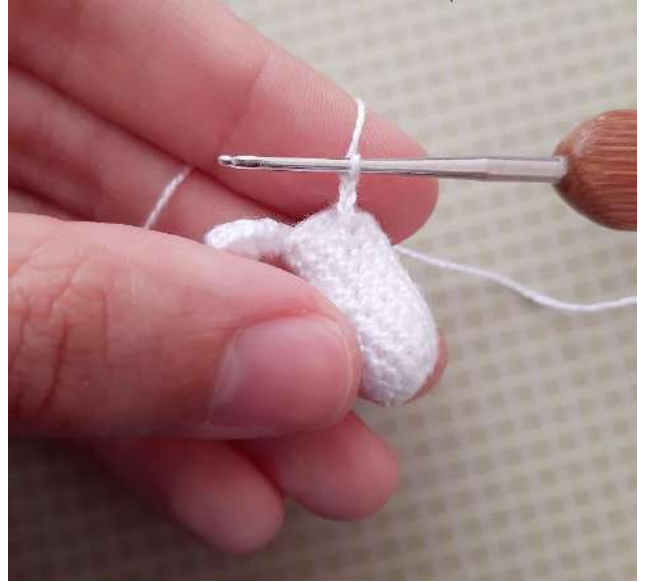
Now insert hook through the first sc of last row of body and the last sc of last row on the opposite side of body. Make 6 slip stitches joining opposite sides of body.



Repeat leg: make 3 chains, popcorn stitch of 5 dc, 2 chains, tighten the base of popcorn stitch with one more loop from behind and crochet those 2 loops on hook together referring to photos. Make 1 sl st into body. Fasten off leaving long tail of yarn.

Turn the work to make a tail. Choose the place where you'd like tail to be. Insert hook through this place, move forward closely to the knot and pull out the yarn, left for making tail. Make 2 chains. Insert hook under closest stitch of body, make dc. Then make 2 chains, sl st into base of dc, fasten off and hide the end inside.







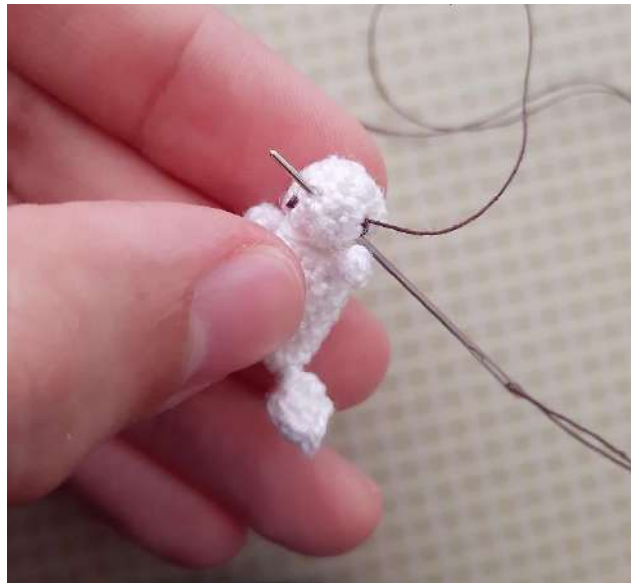
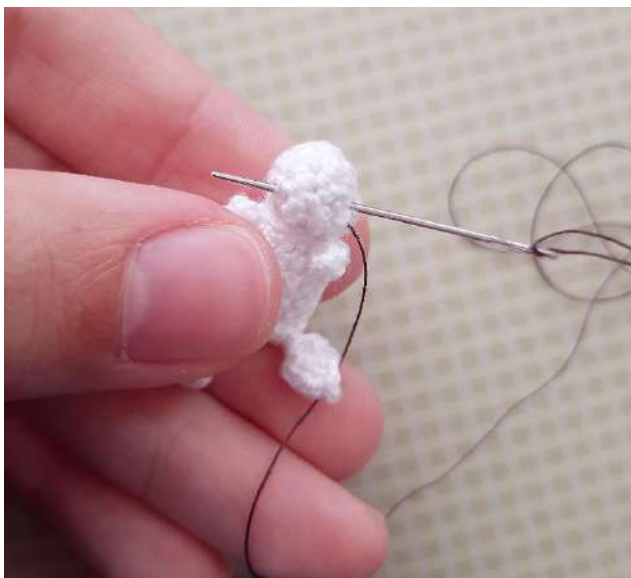


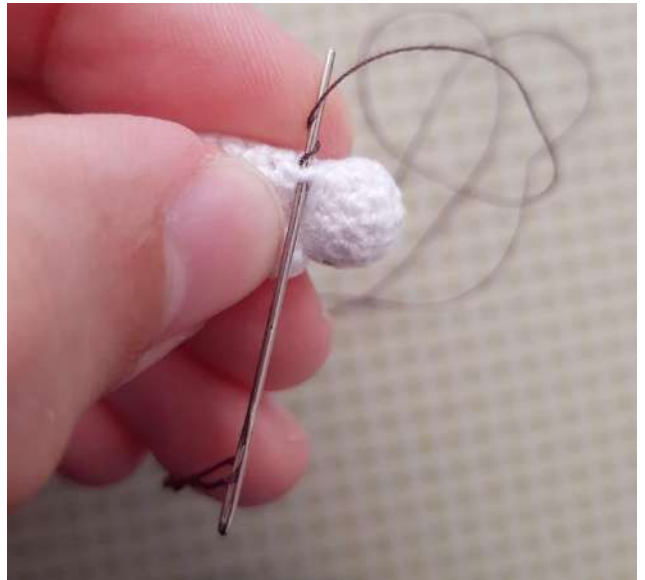
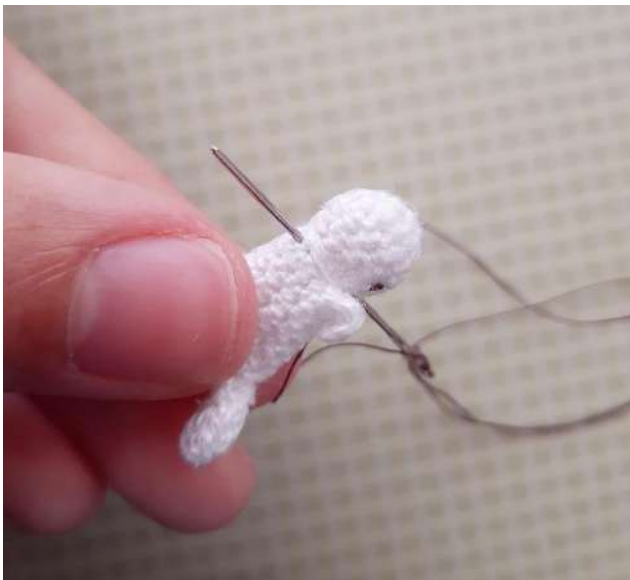
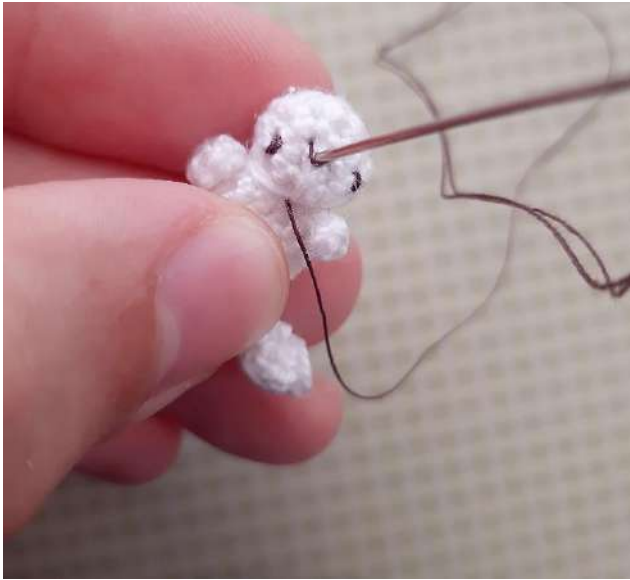
Take a needle and sew thread. Make neck tightening the thread as shown.





Then make eyes with dark thread.







EARS

At such tiny size it's very hard to sew details one to another. That's why I invented such a technique. Follow my instructions and photos.

Insert hook into place you'd like ear to be. Pull the yarn, make 3 ch, 3 dc into same place. Ch 3, turn, make 3 dc worked off together. Ch 2, turn, 4 sl st along inner border of ear, sl st into head. Fasten off leaving a long tail for making second ear.







Pull the yarn out in opposite side of head, repeat an ear. Hide the tail of yarn inside when you finish.







DECORATION

Use textile markers, color pencils or kids chalk to decorate bunny.
