



YOU'LL NEED

The overall idea behind these decorations is to utilize what's available on hand: leftover yarn, scraps of ribbon and embroidery floss, lonely buttons, old beads and so on. Let's stay eco-friendly and make this world a little bit better!

- yarn of your choice (we used mixed cotton/polyacryl) and cotton yarn); choose the colors you like best;
- crochet hook suitable for the yarn you have;
- sewing and tapestry needles;
- scissors;
- toy stuffing (fiberfill);
- stitch marker;
- scraps of yarn, embroidery floss and any crafting materials you like for decorating.

- *Please read the instruction carefully getting*
- *Work in spiral, without closing rounds with a slip stitch, unless stated otherwise.*
- *Crochet tightly to prevent little gaps between the stitches.*
- *Add stuffing in small portions so it's distributed evenly.*

ABBREVIATIONS

MR – magic ring;

ch – chain;

st, sts – stitch, stitches;

sl st – slip stitch;

sc – single crochet;

spike st – single crochet spike stitch*;

hdc – half double crochet;

dec – decrease;

inc – increase;

fl, flo – front loops, work in front loops only;

bl, blo – back loops, work in back loops only;

(...) – number of stitches in the round.

**Single crochet spike stitch (spike st) is worked exactly like a regular single crochet stitch except that instead of working into the current round where you are crocheting, you drop down and work it into a corresponding stitch one round below.*

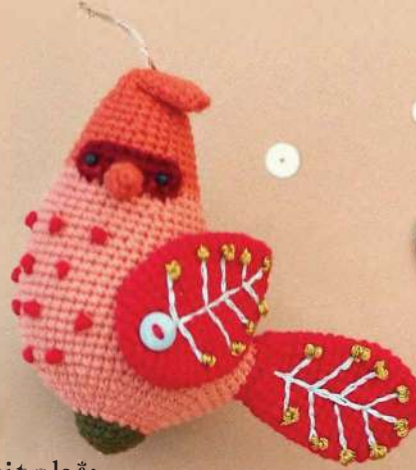

CHRISTMAS BAUBLE #1

Start in Coral Red.

Rnd 1: 6 sc in a MR (6 st)

Rnd 2: inc in all 6 st (12 st)

Rnd 3: (sc, inc) repeat 6 times (18 st)

Rnd 4: sc, (inc, 2 sc) repeat 5 times, inc, sc (24 st)

Rnd 5: (3 sc, inc) repeat 6 times (30 st)

Rnd 6: 2 sc, (inc, 4 sc) repeat 5 times, inc, 2 sc (36 st)

Rnd 7: (5 sc, inc) repeat 6 times (42 st)

Rnd 8: 3 sc, (inc, 6 sc) repeat 5 times, inc, 3 sc (48 st)

Rnd 9: (7 sc, inc) repeat 6 times (54 st)

Rnd 10: 4 sc, (inc, 8 sc) repeat 5 times, inc, 4 sc (60 st)

Rnd 11: sc in every st around (60 st)

From now on, continue in the stripe pattern (see diagram).

Rnds 12-21: sc in every st around (60 st) (10 rounds)

Change to Coral Red.

Rnd 22: sc in every st around (60 st)

Rnd 23: 4 sc, (dec, 8 sc) repeat 5 times, dec, 4 sc (54 st)

Rnd 24: (7 sc, dec) repeat 6 times (48 st)

Rnd 25: 3 sc, (dec, 6 sc) repeat 5 times, dec, 3 sc (42 st)

Rnd 26: (5 sc, dec) repeat 6 times (36 st)

Rnd 27: 2 sc, (dec, 4 sc) repeat 5 times, dec, 2 sc (30 st)

Rnd 28: (3 sc, dec) repeat 6 times (24 st)

Rnd 29: sc, (dec, 2 sc) repeat 5 times, dec, sc (18 st)

Stuff your work very, very firmly. It should be as firm as a tennis ball.

Change to Green.

Rnds 30-32: sc in every st (18 st) (3 rounds).

Rnd 33: dec repeat 9 times (9 st)

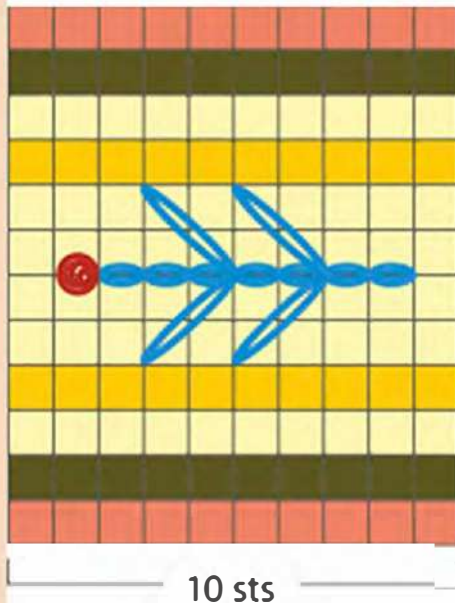
Fasten off leaving a tail about 15 cm long and cut the yarn.

Using a tapestry needle, weave the yarn tail through the front loops of each of the nine stitches and pull tight to close.

Make a loop for hanging out of the yarn tail.

Using scraps of yarn in different colors, decorate the center part of your bauble with embroidery (see diagram).

CHRISTMAS BAUBLE #2

Start in Red

Rnd 1: 6 sc in a MR (6 st)

Rnd 2: (sc, inc) repeat 3 times (9 st)

Rnd 3: sc in every st around (9 st)

Rnd 4: (2 sc, inc) repeat 3 times (12 st)

Rnd 5: sc in every st around (12 st)

Rnd 6: (3 sc, inc) repeat 3 times (15 st)

Rnd 7: (4 sc, inc) repeat 3 times (18 st)

Rnd 8: sc, (inc, 2 sc) repeat 5 times, inc, sc (24 st)

Rnd 9: (3 sc, inc) repeat 6 times (30 st)

Rnd 10: 2 sc, (inc, 4 sc) repeat 5 times, inc, 2 sc (36 st)

Rnd 11: (5 sc, inc) repeat 6 times (42 st)

Rnd 12: 3 sc, (inc, 6 sc) repeat 5 times, inc, 3 sc (48 st)

Rnd 13: (7 sc, inc) repeat 6 times (54 st)

Rnd 14: 4 sc, (inc, 8 sc) repeat 5 times, inc, 4 sc (60 st)

From now on, continue in the stripe pattern (see diagram below).

Rnds 15-26: sc in every st around (60 st) (12 rounds)

Change to Red.

Note: You can change the size and shape of your ornament by adding a few rounds without decs/incs here and there.

Rnd 27: 4 sc, (dec, 8 sc) repeat 5 times, dec, 4 sc (54 st)

Rnd 28: (7 sc, dec) repeat 6 times (48 st)

Rnd 29: 3 sc, (dec, 6 sc) repeat 5 times, dec, 3 sc (42 st)

Rnd 30: (5 sc, dec) repeat 6 times (36 st)

Rnd 31: 2 sc, (dec, 4 sc) repeat 5 times, dec, 2 sc (30 st)

Rnd 32: (3 sc, dec) repeat 6 times (24 st)

Rnd 33: sc, (dec, 2 sc) repeat 5 times, dec, sc (18 st)

Rnds 34-36: sc in every st (18 st) (3 rounds)

Stuff your work very, very firmly. It should be as firm as a tennis ball.

Change to Mustard Yellow.

Rnds 37-39: sc in every st (18 st) (3 rounds)

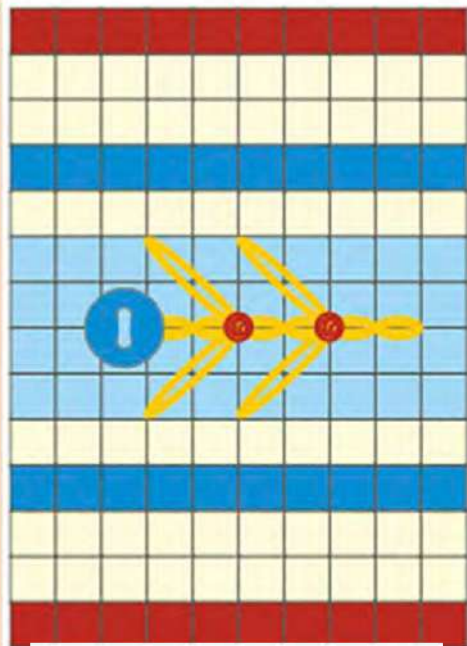
Rnd 40: dec repeat 9 times (9 st)

Fasten off leaving a tail about 15 cm long and cut the yarn.

Using a tapestry needle, weave the yarn tail through the front loops of each of the nine stitches and pull tight to close. Make a loop for hanging out of the yarn tail. Using scraps of yarn in different colors, decorate the center part of your bauble with embroidery (see diagram).

Add a few buttons in matching colors, if desired.

CHICKEN ORNAMENT

BODY

Start in Blue.

Rnd 1: 6 sc in a MR (6 st) (leave a yarn tail to create a loop for hanging)

Rnd 2: inc in all 6 st (12 st)

Rnd 3: (sc, inc) repeat 6 times (18 st)

Rnd 4: sc, (inc, 2 sc) repeat 5 times, inc, sc (24 st)

Rnd 5: (3 sc, inc) repeat 6 times (30 st)

Rnd 6: 2 sc, (inc, 4 sc) repeat 5 times, inc, 2 sc (36 st)

Rnd 7: (5 sc, inc) repeat 6 times (42 st)

Rnd 8: 3 sc, (inc, 6 sc) repeat 5 times, inc, 3 sc (48 st)

Rnd 9: (7 sc, inc) repeat 6 times (54 st)

Rnd 10: 4 sc, (inc, 8 sc) repeat 5 times, inc, 4 sc (60 st)

Rnds 11-20: sc in every st around (60 st) (10 rounds)

Rnd 21: 4 sc, (dec, 8 sc) repeat 5 times, dec, 4 sc (54 st)

Rnd 22: (7 sc, dec) repeat 6 times (48 st)

Rnd 23: 3 sc, (dec, 6 sc) repeat 5 times, dec, 3 sc (42 st)

Rnd 24: (5 sc, dec) repeat 6 times (36 st)

Rnd 25: 2 sc, (dec, 4 sc) repeat 5 times, dec, 2 sc (30 st)

Rnd 26: (3 sc, dec) repeat 6 times (24 st)

Rnd 27: sc, (dec, 2 sc) repeat 5 times, dec, sc (18 st)

Stuff your work very, very firmly. It should be as firm as a tennis ball.

Change to Dark Blue.

Rnds 28-30: sc in every st (18 st) (3 rounds)

Rnd 31: dec repeat 9 times (9 st)

Fasten off leaving a tail about 15 cm long and cut the yarn.

Using a tapestry needle, weave the yarn tail through the front loops of each of the nine stitches and pull tight to close.



HEAD

Start in Dark Blue.

Rnd 1: 4 sc in a MR (4 st)

Rnd 2: (inc, sc) repeat 2 times (6 st)

Rnd 3: sc in every st around (6 st)

Change to Off-White.

Rnd 4: inc, 3 sc, 2 inc (9 st)

Rnd 5: inc, 6 sc, 2 inc (12 st)

Rnd 6: inc, 9 sc, 2 inc (15 st)

Rnd 7: (4 sc, inc) repeat 3 times (18 st)

Rnd 8: (5 sc, inc) repeat 3 times (21 st)

Rnd 9: 3 sc, (inc, 6 sc) repeat 2 times, inc, 3 sc (24 st)

Rnd 10: (7 sc, inc) repeat 3 times (27 st)

Rnd 11: 4 sc, (inc, 8 sc) repeat 2 times, inc, 4 sc (30 st)

Rnd 12: (9 sc, inc) repeat 3 times (33 st)

Rnd 13: 5 sc, (inc, 10 sc) repeat 2 times, inc, 5 sc (36 st)

Change to Baby Blue.

Rnd 14: Working BLO, (11 sc, inc) repeat 3 times (39 st)

Rnd 15: 6 sc, (inc, 12 sc) repeat 2 times, inc, 6 sc (42 st)

Rnd 16: (13 sc, inc) repeat 3 times (45 st)

Rnd 17: 7 sc, (inc, 14 sc) repeat 2 times, inc, 7 sc (48 st)

Rnd 18: (15 sc, inc) repeat 3 times (51 st)

Rnd 19: 8 sc, (inc, 16 sc) repeat 2 times, inc, 8 sc (54 st)

Rnd 20: Working FLO, slst, (skip 1 st, 5 hdc in the same st, skip 1 st, slst) repeat 13 times, slst.

Fasten off, cut the yarn.

Stuff the head, sew it to the body at approx. 45° angle.

Using scraps of red yarn, embroider 5 french knots on the head (3 over the beak and 2 under it) to give the chicken its features.

Give it some eyes as well (beads, tiny buttons, embroidery).





TAIL

In Dark Blue.

First, to make the tail, you need to crochet three identical parts (“feathers”) which will be then joined together.

Parts 1, 2

Rnd 1: 6 sc in a MR (6 st)

Rnd 2: inc in all 6 st (12 st)

Rnds 3-5: sc in every st around (12 st) (3 rounds)

Fasten off, cut the yarn. For Part 3, follow the instructions for Parts 1, 2, however don't fasten off, as you will now join the parts together.

Rnd 6: Working on Part 3, 6 sc; join Part 2 with a sc, 5 more sc along Part 2; join Part 1 with a sc, 11 more sc along Part 1, 6 sc along Part 2, 6 sc along Part 3. Now the “feathers” are joined and you have 36 sc in the round (36 st)

Rnds 7-11: sc in every st around (36 st) (5 rounds)

Fasten off, cut the yarn.

Using scraps of yarn in different colors, decorate the tail according to your liking. Sew the tail to the body on the same axis as the head.



WINGS (make 2)

In Coral Red.

Rnd 1: 6 sc in a MR (6 st)

Rnd 2: inc in all 6 st (12 st)

Rnd 3: (sc, inc) repeat 6 times (18 st)

Rnd 4: sc, (inc, 2 sc) repeat 5 times, inc, sc (24 st)

Rnd 5-7: sc in every st around (24 st) (3 rounds)

Rnd 8: (7 sc, inc) repeat 3 times (27 st)

Rnds 9-11: sc in every st around (27 st) (3 rounds)

Rnd 12: (7 sc, dec) repeat 3 times (24 st)

Rnd 13: sc in every st around (24 st)

Rnd 14: (6 sc, dec) repeat 3 times (21 st)

Rnd 15: sc in every st around (21 st)

Rnd 16: (5 sc, dec) repeat 3 times (18 st)

Rnd 17: sc in every st around (18 st)

Rnd 18: (4 sc, dec) repeat 3 times (15 st)

Rnd 19: (3 sc, dec) repeat 3 times (12 st)

Rnd 20: (2 sc, dec) repeat 3 times (9 st)

Rnd 21: (sc, dec) repeat 3 times (6 st)

Fasten off leaving a tail about 10 cm long and cut the yarn. Using a tapestry needle, weave the yarn tail through the front loops of each of the six stitches and pull tight to close. Weave in the end.

Decorate the wings with embroidery, beads and small buttons in different colors. Sew the wings to the sides of the body.

NORTHERN CARDINAL

BODY

Start in Red.

Rnd 1: 6 sc in a MR (6 st)

Rnd 2: inc in all 6 st (12 st)

Rnd 3: (sc, inc) repeat 6 times (18 st)

Rnds 4-5: sc in every st around (18 st)

Change to Coral Red.

Rnd 6: sc, (inc, 2 sc) repeat 5 times, inc, sc (24 st)

Rnd 7: (3 sc, inc) repeat 6 times (30 st)

Rnd 8: 2 sc, (inc, 4 sc) repeat 5 times, inc, 2 sc (36 st)

Rnd 9: (5 sc, inc) repeat 6 times (42 st)

Rnd 10: 3 sc, (inc, 6 sc) repeat 5 times, inc, 3 sc (48 st)

Rnd 11: (7 sc, inc) repeat 6 times (54 st)

Rnd 12: 4 sc, (inc, 8 sc) repeat 5 times, inc, 4 sc (60 st)

Rnds 13-19: sc in every st around (60 st) (7 rounds)

Rnd 20: skip 12 sts, sc in the 13th st, 47 sc (48 st)

You've just divided your work in two unequal parts (60 - 48 + 12); keep working around the larger one.

Rnd 21: sc in every st around (48 st)

Rnd 22: 7 sc, (dec, 14 sc) repeat 2 times, dec, 7 sc (45 st)

Rnd 23: sc in every st around (45 st)

Rnd 24: (13 sc, dec) repeat 3 times (42 st)

Rnd 25: sc in every st around (42 st)

Rnd 26: 6 sc, (dec, 12 sc) repeat 2 times, dec, 6 sc (39 st)

Rnd 27: sc in every st around (39 st)

Rnd 28: (11 sc, dec) repeat 3 times (36 st)

Rnd 29: sc in every st around (36 st)

Flatten your work; using a strand of yarn in matching color, sew the 12 sts gap closed, stitch to stitch.

This will be the base for sewing the tail. Start gradually stuffing the body.

Rnd 30: 5 sc, (dec, 10 sc) repeat 2 times, dec, 5 sc (33 st)

Rnd 31: sc in every st around (33 st)

Rnd 32: (9 sc, dec) repeat 3 times (30 st)

Rnd 33: sc in every st around (30 st)

Rnd 34: 4 sc, (dec, 8 sc) repeat 2 times, dec, 4 sc (27 st)

Rnd 35: sc in every st around (27 st)

Rnd 36: (7 sc, dec) repeat 3 times (24 st)

Rnd 37: sc in every st around (24 st)

Rnd 38: 3 sc, (dec, 6 sc) repeat 2 times, dec, 3 sc (21 st)

Rnd 39: sc in every st around (21 st)

Rnd 40: (5 sc, dec) repeat 3 times (18 st)

Rnd 41: sc in every st around (18 st)

Stuff your work very firmly. Leave the upper part (the last 6-9 rounds of the work) unstuffed as it will form the bird's crest.

Rnd 42: 2 sc, (dec, 4 sc) repeat 2 times, dec, 2 sc (15 st)

Rnd 43: sc in every st around (15 st)

Rnd 44: (3 sc, dec) repeat 3 times (12 st)

Rnd 45: sc in every st around (12 st)

Rnd 46: sc, (dec, 2 sc) repeat 2 times, sc (9 st)

Rnd 47: sc in every st around (9 st)

Rnd 48: (dec, sc) repeat 3 times (6 st)

Fasten off leaving a tail about 10 cm long and cut the yarn.

Using a tapestry needle, weave the yarn tail through the front loops of each of the six stitches and pull tight to close. Bend the unstuffed upper part of the head to the side and sew it with a couple of stitches in the position like the photos. Weave in your yarn tail once complete.





FACE PATCH I

In Brown.

Ch 9; starting from the 2nd ch from the hook, 7 sc, 3 sc in the last ch; working on the other side of the chain, 6 sc, inc (18 st)

Fasten off, cut the yarn, hide the tail on the wrong side of the work.

You may leave a long tail for sewing, but since this part is so very small, it will be more convenient to divide the yarn into strands and use a single one to make the stitches almost invisible.

BEAK*

In Red.

Rnd 1: 4 sc in a MR (4 st)

Rnd 2: (inc, sc) repeat 2 times (6 st)

Rnd 3: sc in every st around (6 st)

Fasten off, cut the yarn.

As this part is very small, it's highly recommended to use a thread or a single strand of yarn in the matching colour for sewing.

*Alternatively, you may use a pyramid-shaped button instead of a crocheted part.

WINGS (make 2)

Repeat instructions for chicken wings.

TAIL

In Coral Red.

Rnd 1: 6 sc in a MR (6 st)

Rnd 2: inc in all 6 st (12 st)

Rnd 3: (sc, inc) repeat 6 times (18 st)

Rnd 4: (5 sc, inc) repeat 3 times (21 st)

Rnd 5: 3 sc, (inc, 6 sc) repeat 2 times, inc, 3 sc (24 st)

Rnd 6-8: sc in every st around (24 st) (3 rounds)

Rnd 9: (6 sc, dec) repeat 3 times (21 st)

Rnds 10-12: sc in every st around (21 st) (3 rounds)

Rnd 13: (5 sc, dec) repeat 3 times (18 st)

Rnds 14-15: sc in every st around (18 st) (2 rounds)

Rnd 16: (4 sc, dec) repeat 3 times (15 st)

Rnds 17-18: sc in every st around (15 st) (2 rounds)

Make a slst, fasten off leaving a long yarn tail for sewing.

Flatten the tail and decorate both sides with embroidery and/or beads/small buttons. Sew the tail to the back of the bird's body, parallel to the base (between rounds 21 and 28).

STAR

We will create two halves of the star, and join them together. They may differ in color and decor.

Half a star.

Start in White.

Work in the BLO for rounds 2-10, stuff the toy during assembly.

Rnd 1: 6 sc in a MR (6 st)

Rnd 2: inc in all 6 st (12 st)

Rnd 3: (1 sc, inc) repeat 6 times (18 st)

Rnd 4: (2 sc, inc) repeat 6 times (24 st)

Rnd 5: (3 sc, inc) repeat 6 times (30 st)

Rnd 6: (4 sc, inc) repeat 6 times (36 st)

Rnd 7: (5 sc, inc) repeat 6 times (42 st)

Rnd 8: (6 sc, inc) repeat 6 times (48 st)

Rnd 9: (7 sc, inc) repeat 6 times (54 st)

Rnd 10: (8 sc, inc) repeat 6 times (60 st)

Don't cut the yarn.

Start to crochet the rays of the star. There are five of them.

Crochet in rows.

At the end of each row, do not chain 1 and turn, instead you will simply turn your work, and crochet into the second stitch from the hook.

Row 1: Working BLO, sc in all 12 st

Row 2: sc in all 11 st

Row 3: sc in all 10 st

Row 4: sc in all 9 st

Row 5: sc in all 8 st

Row 6: sc in all 7 st

Row 7: sc in all 6 st

Row 8: sc in all 5 st

Row 9: sc in all 4 st

Row 10: sc in all 3 st

Row 11: sc in all 2 st

Row 12: sc in all 1 st

Cut and hide the yarn end.

Go back to round 10. Join the White yarn and repeat instructions 1-12, 4 more times, for a total of 5 rays.

On the second star half, after making the 5th triangle point, you could keep the yarn and not to cut it, and use it to join the two halves together.



Go back to round 2. Join the Turquoise yarn to the beginning of the 2nd rnd and crochet FLO sl st in a spiral to the end of the 10th rnd.



With a slip stitch connect the spiral in a circle, change the yarn to Coral color. Turn your work and crochet in a spiral on round 10.

Rnd 1: Working FLO, 1 ch, 2 hdc in each stitch (120 st)

Rnd 2: sc in all 120 st

Change to Yellow.

Rnd 3: sl st in all 120 st

Cut and hide the yarn end.



Once you have completed two halves of the star, join them together with pins. Using your white yarn, sc through both sides of each half to join them. At the top of each stars' ray, complete 3sc in one stitch, and when working in the space between each ray at the bottom of the work, add 2 sc- this is to ensure there are no holes.

Cut and hide the yarn end. Make a loop for hanging out of the yarn tail. Using scraps of yarn in different colors, decorate your star with embroidery. Add a few buttons in matching colors, if desired.

MUSHROOM

Start in Turquoise. Work in the BLO for rounds 2-12. Stuff as you go.

Rnd 1: 6 sc in a MR (6 st) (leave a yarn tail to create a loop for hanging)

Rnd 2: inc in all 6 st (12 st)

Rnd 3: (1 sc, inc) repeat 6 times (18 st)

Rnd 4: (2 sc, inc) repeat 6 times (24 st)

Rnd 5: sc in every st around (24 st)

Rnd 6: (3 sc, inc) repeat 6 times (30 st)

Rnd 7: (4 sc, inc) repeat 6 times (36 st)

Rnd 8: (5 sc, inc) repeat 6 times (42 st)

Rnd 9: (6 sc, inc) repeat 6 times (48 st)

Rnds 10-12: sc in all 48 st (3 rounds)

Rnd 13: Working FLO, sc in every st around (48 st)

Rnd 14: sc spike stitch 1 round below in all 48 st

Take note to not catch the remaining from loop from round 13 as we will need that loop later



Change to Orange.

Start crocheting the first frill of the mushroom.

Rnd 1: 1 ch, 2 hdc in each stitch (96 st)



Change to Yellow.

Rnd 2: sl st in every st around (96 st)

Cut and hide the yarn end.

Go back to round 13. Join the Coral yarn and continue to crochet the mushroom.

Rnd 15: Working BLO, sl st in every st around (48 st)

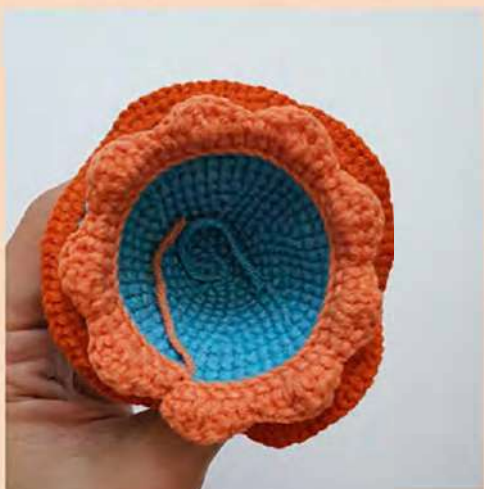
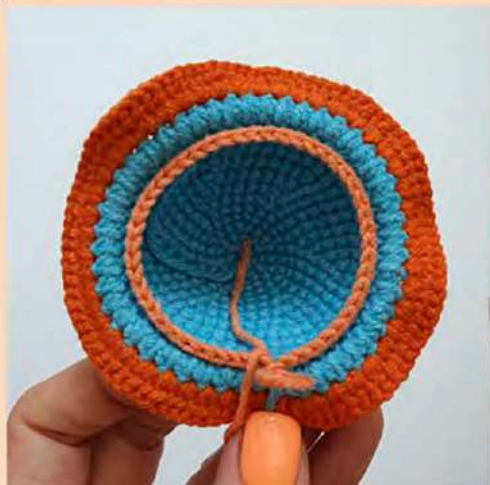
Start crocheting the second frill of the mushroom.

Rnd 1: Working FLO, (7 sc, inc) repeat 6 times (54 st)

(1 sc, 1 hdc, 3 dc in one stitch, 1 hdc, 1 sc, 1 sl st) repeat 9 times

Finish it with a slip stitch and then an invisible finish.

Cut and hide the yarn end.



Go back to round 12.

Join the Turquoise yarn to the beginning of the 12th round, and sl st in a spiral using the FLO to the end of the 2nd rnd and crochet FLO sl st in a spiral to the end of the 2nd rnd. Finish with a slip stitch and then an invisible finish. Fasten off, cut and hide the yarn end.



Go back to round 15. Join the White yarn and crochet

Rnd 16: Working BLO, sc in all 48 st

Rnd 17: (6 sc, dec) repeat 6 times (42 st)

Rnd 18: (5 sc, dec) repeat 6 times (36 st)

Rnd 19: (4 sc, dec) repeat 6 times (30 st)

Rnd 20: (3 sc, dec) repeat 6 times (24 st)

Rnd 21: (1 sc, dec) repeat 8 times (16 st)

Rnd 22: sl st in every st around (16 st)

Rnd 23: sc spike stitch 1 round below (3 sc, inc) repeat 4 times (20 st)

Rnd 24: sc in every st around (20 st)

Rnd 25: (4 sc, inc) repeat 4 times (24 st)

Rnd 26: sc in every st around (24 st)

Rnd 27: (3 sc, inc) repeat 6 times (30 st)

Rnds 28-33: sc in every st around (30 st) (6 rounds)

Rnd 34: (3 sc, dec) repeat 6 times (24 st)

Rnd 35: (2 sc, dec) repeat 6 times (18 st)

Rnd 36: (1 sc, dec) repeat 6 times (12 st)

Rnd 37: dec repeat 6 times (6 st)

Fasten off leaving a tail about 10 cm long and cut the yarn.

Using a tapestry needle, weave the yarn tail through the front loops of each of the six stitches and pull tight to close. Weave in the end.

Decorate with embroidery and/or beads/small buttons.



SNAIL

Crochet in Yellow. Don't stuff.

Rnd 1: 3 sc in a MR (3 st)

Rnd 2: 2 sc, inc (4 st)

Rnd 3: 3 sc, inc (5 st)

Rnd 4: 4 sc, inc (6 st)

Rnd 5: 5 sc, inc (7 st)

Rnd 6: 6 sc, inc (8 st)

Rnd 7: 7 sc, inc (9 st)
Rnd 8: 8 sc, inc (10 st)
Rnd 9: 9 sc, inc (11 st)
Rnd 10: 10 sc, inc (12 st)
Rnds 11-22: sc in every st around (12 st) (12 rounds)
Rnd 23: 7 ch and crochet from the second stitch from the hook 6 sl st, 5 sc for both loops together (see img), 7 ch and crochet from the second stitch from the hook 6 sl st. Cut and hide the yarn end. Wrap the tail of the snail and sew it in place with your needle and yarn. Embroider the eyes.

OWL

HEAD AND BODY

Start in Baby Blue. Stuff as you go until round 34.

First, we need to crochet the owl's ears. Start crocheting the first ear.

Rnd 1: 6 sc in a MR (6 st) (leave a yarn tail to create a loop for hanging)

Rnd 2: (1 sc, inc) repeat 3 times (9 st)

Rnd 3: sc in every st around (9 st)

Rnd 4: (2 sc, inc) repeat 3 times (12 st)

Finish it with a slip st and then an invisible stitch.

Cut and hide the yarn end.

Second ear.

Repeat rounds 1-4 as per above, however, do not cut the yarn as we will continue on from round 4 to join the ears together.

Start crocheting the head

Rnd 5: (Joining ears)

ch 4, connect to the first ear 12 sc, 4 sc onto the ch 4, 12 sc on second ear, 4 sc onto the ch 4 (32 st)

Rnd 6: (7 sc, inc) repeat 4 times (36 st)

Rnd 7: (5 sc, inc) repeat 6 times (42 st)

Rnds 8-9: sc in every st around (42 st) (2 rounds)

Rnd 10: (6 sc, inc) repeat 6 times (48 st)

Rnds 11-12: sc in every st around (48 st) (2 rounds)

Rnd 13: (7 sc, inc) repeat 6 times (54 st)

Rnd 14: sc in every st around (54 st)

Change to Dark turquoise.

Start crocheting the body.

Rnds 15-16: Working BLO, sc in every st around (54 st) (2 rounds)



- Rnd 17: sc in every st around (54 st)
- Rnd 18: Working BLO, sc in every st around (54 st)
- Rnd 19: (7 sc, dec) repeat 6 times (48 st)
- Rnd 20: Working BLO, sc in every st around (48 st)
- Rnd 21: sc in every st around (48 st)
- Rnd 22: Working BLO, sc in every st around (48 st)
- Rnd 23: (6 sc, dec) repeat 6 times (42 st)
- Rnd 24: Working BLO, sc in every st around (42 st)
- Rnd 25: sc in every st around (42 st)
- Rnd 26: Working BLO, sc in every st around (42 st)
- Rnd 27: (5 sc, dec) repeat 6 times (36 st)
- Rnd 28: Working BLO, sc in every st around (36 st)
- Rnd 29: (4 sc, dec) repeat 6 times (30 st)
- Rnd 30: Working BLO, sc in every st around (30 st)
- Rnd 31: (3 sc, dec) repeat 6 times (24 st)
- Rnd 32: Working BLO, sc in every st around (24 st)
- Rnd 33: (2 sc, dec) repeat 6 times (18 st)
- Rnd 34: Working BLO, sc in every st around (18 st)
- Rnd 35: (1 sc, dec) repeat 6 times (12 st)
- Rnd 36: dec repeat 6 times (6 st)

Fasten off leaving a tail about 10 cm long and cut the yarn.

Using a tapestry needle, weave the yarn tail through the front loops of each of the six stitches and pull tight to close. Weave in the end.



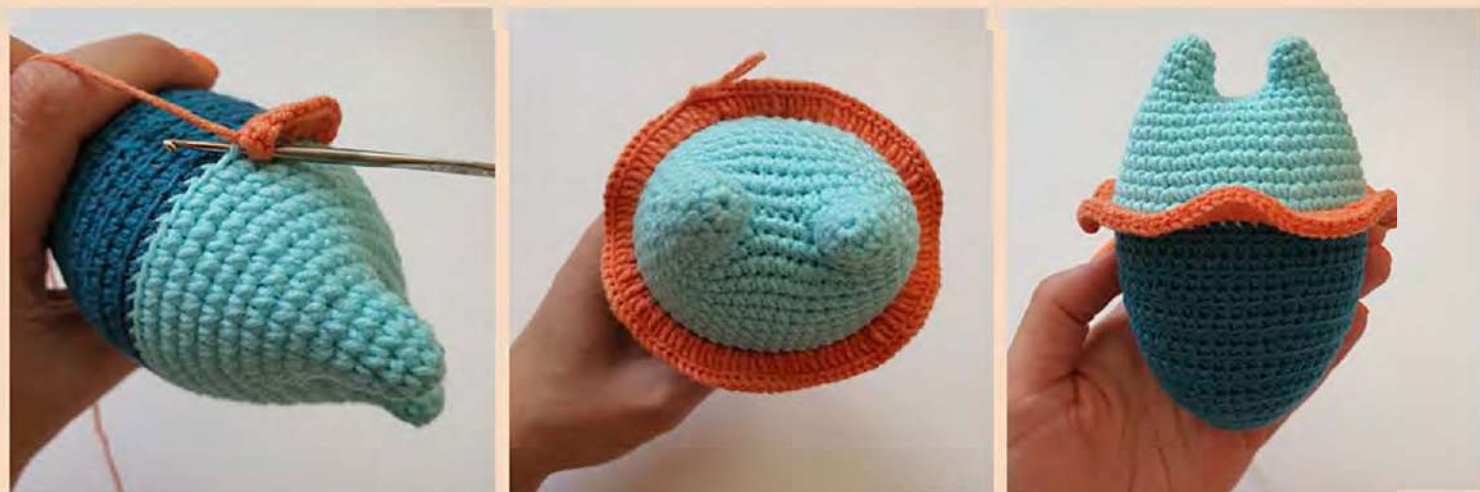
Go back to round 15. Join the Coral yarn and continue to crochet the frill

Rnd 1: Working FLO, 1 ch, 2 hdc in each stitch (108 st)

Change to Yellow.

Rnd 2: sl st in all 108 st

Cut and hide the yarn end.



Start to crochet the feathers of the owl. You can use different colors here.

Go back to round 16. Join the Turquoise yarn and continue to crochet

Rnd 1: Working FLO, sc in every st around (54 st)

Rnd 2: (1 sc, 1 hdc, 3 dc in one stitch, 1 dc, 1 sc, 1 sl st) repeat 9 times

Finish it with a slip stitch and then an invisible finish.

Cut and hide the yarn end.

Go back to round 18. Skip 3 sts, join the Turquoise yarn and continue to crochet

Rnd 1: Working FLO, sc in every st around (54 st)

Rnd 2: (1 sc, 1 hdc, 3 dc in one stitch, 1 hdc, 1 sc, 1 sl st) repeat 9 times

Finish it with a slip stitch and then an invisible finish.

Cut and hide the yarn end.

Go back to round 20. Skip 3 sts, join the Turquoise yarn and continue to crochet

Rnd 1: Working FLO, (1 sc, 1 hdc, 3 dc in one stitch, 1 hdc, 1 sc, 1 sl st) repeat 8 times

Finish it with a slip stitch and then an invisible finish.

Cut and hide the yarn end.

Go back to round 22. Join the Turquoise yarn and continue to crochet

Rnd 1: Working FLO, (1 sc, 1 hdc, 3 dc in one stitch, 1 hdc, 1 sc, 1 sl st) repeat 8 times

Finish it with a slip stitch and then an invisible finish.

Cut and hide the yarn end.

Go back to round 24. Join the Turquoise yarn and continue to crochet

Rnd 1: Working FLO, (1 sc, 1 hdc, 3 dc in one stitch, 1 hdc, 1 sc, 1 sl st) repeat 7 times

Finish it with a slip stitch and then an invisible finish.

Cut and hide the yarn end.

Go back to round 26. Skip 3 sts, join the Turquoise yarn and continue to crochet

Rnd 1: Working FLO, (1 sc, 1 hdc, 3 dc in one stitch, 1 hdc, 1 sc, 1 sl st) repeat 7 times

Finish it with a slip stitch and then an invisible finish.

Cut and hide the yarn end.

Go back to round 28. Skip 3 sts, join the Turquoise yarn and continue to crochet

Rnd 1: Working FLO, (1 sc, 1 hdc, 3 dc in one stitch, 1 hdc, 1 sc, 1 sl st) repeat 6 times

Finish it with a slip stitch and then an invisible finish.

Cut and hide the yarn end.

Go back to round 30. Skip 3 sts, join the Turquoise yarn and continue to crochet

Rnd 1: Working FLO, (1 sc, 1 hdc, 3 dc in one stitch, 1 hdc, 1 sc, 1 sl st) repeat 5 times

Finish it with a slip stitch and then an invisible finish.

Cut and hide the yarn end.

Go back to round 32. Skip 3 sts, join the Turquoise yarn and continue to crochet

Rnd 1: Working FLO, (1 sc, 1 hdc, 3 dc in one stitch, 1 hdc, 1 sc, 1 sl st) repeat 4 times

Finish it with a slip stitch and then an invisible finish.

Cut and hide the yarn end.

Go back to round 34. Skip 3 sts, join the Turquoise yarn and continue to crochet

Rnd 1: Working FLO, (1 sc, 1 hdc, 3 dc in one stitch, 1 hdc, 1 sc, 1 sl st) repeat 3 times

Finish it with a slip stitch and then an invisible finish.

Cut and hide the yarn end.

Decorate the feathers with embroidery, beads, or small buttons in different colors.



EYES (make 2)

Start in White.

Rnd 1: 6 sc in a MR (6 st)

Rnd 2: inc in all 6 st (12 st)

Rnd 3: (1 sc, inc) repeat 6 times (18 st)

Rnd 4: sl st in every st around (18 st)

Change to Yellow.

Rnd 5: Working BL●, sl st in every st around (18 st)

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

WINGS (make 2)

Crochet in White. Don't stuff.

First, we need to crochet 3 parts, which will then be joined together.

Part 1

Rnd 1: 6 sc in a MR (6 st)

Rnd 2: (1 sc, inc) repeat 3 times (9 st)

Rnds 3-8: sc in every st around (9 st) (6 rounds)

Cut and hide the yarn end.

Part 2

Rnd 1: 6 sc in a MR (6 st)

Rnd 2: (1 sc, inc) repeat 3 times (9 st)

Rnds 3-6: sc in every st around (9 st) (4 rounds)

Cut and hide the yarn end.

Part 3

Rnd 1: 6 sc in a MR (6 st)

Rnd 2: (1 sc, inc) repeat 3 times (9 st)

Rnds 3-4: sc in every st around (9 st) (2 rounds)

Don't cut the yarn.

Start to connect the parts together by continuing onwards from round 4 of the third part using the below instructions.

Rnd 1: (Joining parts) Working on Part 3, 4 sc, 5 sc along Part 2, 9 sc along Part 1, 4 sc along Part 2, 5 sc along Part 3 (27 st)

Rnd 2: (7 sc, dec) repeat 3 times (24 st)

Rnd 3: sc in every st around (24 st)

Rnd 4: (6 sc, dec) repeat 3 times (21 st)

Rnd 5: sc in every st around (21 st)

Rnd 6: (5 sc, dec) repeat 3 times (18 st)

Rnd 7: sc in every st around (18 st)

Rnd 8: (1 sc, dec) repeat 6 times (12 st)

Rnd 9: sc in every st around (12 st)

Rnd 10: dec repeat 6 times (6 st)

Fasten off leaving a tail about 10 cm long and cut the yarn.

Using a tapestry needle, weave the yarn tail through the front loops of each of the six stitches and pull tight to close. Weave in the end.

Decorate the wings with embroidery, beads and small buttons in different colors. Sew the wings to the sides of the body.
