

“Christmas Decoration:”

Flashlight, star, sock, glove, drums, candy, heart and gingerbread house



The pattern is written in English using US crochet terminology. Instructions are easy to follow if you are familiar with basic crochet techniques.

Materials:

- 2.5 mm
 - Cotton yarn
- I used Schachenmayr Catania “Original” in red (115), white (106), green (412), green (212), light brown (431), dark brown (162).
- Black embroidery thread
 - Stuffing
 - Yarn needle
 - Stitch markers (different colors)
 - Cardboard
 - Glue

The finished toys are from 7 to 11 cm tall. It may vary though depending on the kind of yarn and hook size used.

You can also use any color of yarn.

Feel free to add accessories to your very own Christmas ornaments.

Abbreviations:

- ch – chain
- sc – single crochet
- st/sts - stitch/stitches
- inc – increase
- hdc – half double crochet
- dc – double crochet
- dec – decrease
- slst - slip stitch
- FO – fasten off
- BLO – use only back loops
- FLO – use only front loops



BODY (make 2)

Use green yarn.

Rnd 1: 5 sc in magic ring [5]

Rnd 2: (inc) x5 [10]

Rnd 3: (sc, 3 sc in next stitch, (fig 1)) x5 [20]



Rnd 4: 2 sc, (3 sc in next stitch, 3 sc) x4, 3 sc in next st, sc [30]

Rnd 5: 3 sc, (3 sc in next stitch, 5 sc) x4, 3 sc in next st, 2 sc, (fig 2) [40]



Rnd 6: dec, 2 sc, (3 sc in next stitch, 2 sc, dec, 3 sc) x4, 3 sc in next st, 3 sc, (fig 3) [45]

Rnd 7: 4 sc, (3 sc in next stitch, 8 sc) x4, 3 sc in next st, 4 sc [55]

Rnd 8: +sc, put your stitch marker here. It will be the new beginning (fig 4).

4 sc, (3 sc in next stitch, 4 sc, dec, 4 sc) x4, 3 sc in next st, 4 sc, dec [60]



Rnd 9: 5 sc, (3 sc in next stitch, 11 sc) x4, 3 sc in next st, 6 sc [70]

Cut the yarn and don't remove the stitch marker for the first piece.

Hide the remaining tail on the right side.

Don't cut the yarn of second piece, we are going to connect two pieces together (fig 7).

How to invisible fasten off:

Use the needle, insert it in both loops of the second stitch after the last stitch (fig 5). Then, insert it only in the back loop and bar of the last stitch (fig 6). Secure the yarn and hide the tail.





Lay the two pieces together with the wrong side outside (fig 8). Insert your hook in the last stitch of the first piece (we left the stitch marker to easy find the last stitch) and pick up the loop of the second piece (fig 9) and pull it through the two stitches (fig 10). Now the pieces are connected. Insert the hook in next two stitches and make a slst (fig 11).

- Make a slip stitch loosely.

Make a slst in next 6 stitches (fig 12). Then, make (ch 1, slst in next 14 st) and repeat it 4 times. Make ch 1, slst in next 7 st (fig 14).

- Stuff the star lightly (fig 13).



Invisible fasten off. Bring the tail of yarn in one of the five star tops. Make a loop to hang the star (fig 15).



Use the thin white thread, embroider the snowflake. Start it from the magic ring, then insert the needle two stitches below the top of star (fig 16, 17). See the photo tutorials bellow:





BODY

Use red (R) and white (W) yarn.

How to change the color of yarn:

With the two loops from the previous yarn on the hook (fig 1), wrap the new yarn around the hook, then pull the new yarn through the two loops of the stitch (fig 2).

- **Tip:** if you change the color of yarn for example (R: inc, W: inc) x3, make sure that you made 2 sts with red yarn and the next stitch will be white.



Rnd 1: Red yarn: 6 sc in magic ring [6]

Attach the white yarn.

Rnd 2: (Red (R): inc, White (W): inc) x3, (fig 3) [12]

Rnd 3: (R: inc, sc, W: inc, sc) x3 [18]

Rnd 4: (R: inc, 2 sc, W: inc, 2 sc) x3, (fig 4) [24]



- **Tip:** give the tail of the previous yarn a nice tug when changing yarn colors, to prevent loose stitches. You will notice the big loops at the back. Make sure the loops are loose enough to stretch when you stuff the body (fig 5). Otherwise, you will have a scrunched candy.



Rnd 5: R: 3 sc, (W: 4 sc, R: 4 sc) x2, W: 4 sc, R: inc [25]

Rnd 6: R: 2 sc, (W: 4 sc, R: 4 sc) x2, W: 4 sc, R: 3 sc [25]

Rnd 7: R: sc, (W: 4 sc, R: 4 sc) x2, W: 4 sc, R: 4 sc [25]

Rnd 8: (W: 4 sc, R: 4 sc) x3, W: sc [25]

Rnd 9: W: 3 sc, (R: 4 sc, W: 4 sc) x2, R: 4 sc, W: 2 sc [25]

Rnd 10: W: 2 sc, (R: 4 sc, W: 4 sc) x2, R: 4 sc, W: 3 sc [25]

Rnd 11: W: sc, (R: 4 sc, W: 4 sc) x3 [25]

Rnd 12: (R: 4 sc, W: 4 sc) x3, R: sc [25]

• **Tip:** Our candy is crocheting in spiral and has 6 lines: 3- red and 3 – white. The changing of the color for each line is going **one stitch before** (fig 6).

Start to stuff the candy.



Rnd 13: R: 3 sc, (W: 4 sc, R: 4 sc) x2, W: 4 sc, R: 2 sc [25]

Rnd 14: R: 2 sc, (W: 4 sc, R: 4 sc) x2, W: 4 sc, R: 3 sc [25]

Rnd 15: R: sc, (W: 4 sc, R: 4 sc) x3 [25]

Rnd 16: (W: 4 sc, R: 4 sc) x3, W: sc [25]

Rnd 17: W: 3 sc, (R: 4 sc, W: 4 sc) x2, R: 4 sc, W: 2 sc [25]

Rnd 18: W: 2 sc, (R: 4 sc, W: 4 sc) x2, R: 4 sc, W: 3 sc [25]

Rnd 19: W: sc, (R: 4 sc, W: 4 sc) x3 [25]

Rnd 20: (R: 4 sc, W: 4 sc) x3, R: sc [25]

Rnd 21: R: 3 sc, (W: 4 sc, R: 4 sc) x2, W: 4 sc, R: 2 sc [25]

Rnd 22: R: 2 sc, (W: 4 sc, R: 4 sc) x2, W: 4 sc, R: 3 sc [25]

Rnd 23: R: sc, (W: 4 sc, R: 4 sc) x3 (fig 7) [25]



Rnd 24: (W: 4 sc, R: 4 sc) x2, W: 4 sc, R: 3 sc, dec [24]

Rnd 25: (W: dec, 2 sc, R: dec, 2 sc) x3 [18]

Rnd 26: (W: dec, sc, R: dec, sc) x3 [12]

Rnd 27: (W: dec, R: dec) x3 [6]

Stuff the candy firmly (fig 8).



Cut the yarn, leave a tail for closing.

How to close the end of the round: with a darning needle, insert the remaining yarn through all the front loops of the stitches on the last round (fig 9, 10). Pull all together at once and sew to hide the yarn inside the part you are working on.



TAIL (make 2)

Use the red yarn.

Leave a long starting tail.

Ch 6. Make a slst in the first chain (fig 11).

Rnd 1: ch 1 (don't count it as the first st), (inc) x6, slst in first st, (fig 12) [12]

Rnd 2: ch 1, (sc, inc) x6, slst in first st [18]

Rnd 3: ch 1, 18 sc, slst in first st [18]

Invisible fasten off (fig 13).



Sew the tails to the body between rounds 1 and 2 on the one side and between rounds 57 and 58 on the other side using the starting tail (fig 14, 15).



THUMB

Use green yarn.

Rnd 1: 6 sc in magic ring [6]

Rnd 2: (inc) x6 [12]

Rnd 3-5: sc around, (fig 1) [12], **3 rounds**
Fasten off.



GLOVE

Use the green yarn.

Rnd 1: 6 sc in magic ring [6]

Rnd 2: (inc) x6 [12]

Rnd 3: (inc, sc) x6 [18]

Rnd 4: (2 sc, inc) x6 [24]

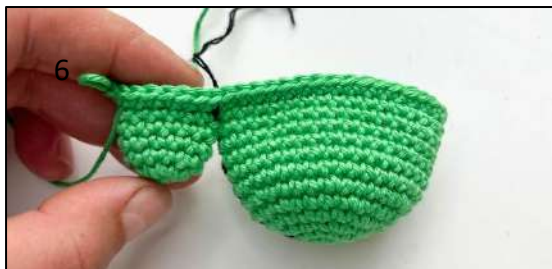
Rnd 5: (inc, 3 sc) x6 [30]

Rnd 6: 2 sc, (inc, 4 sc) x5, inc, 2 sc [36]

Rnd 7-12: sc around, (fig 2) [36], **6 rounds**



Now, we are going to connect the thumb with glove. Insert your hook in the first stitch of the thumb and pick up the yarn (fig 3, 4). Crochet 12 sc around the thumb (fig 5), then go back to the glove and crochet 36 sc around the glove (fig 6).



Rnd 13: together: 12 sc around the thumb, 36 sc around the glove [48]

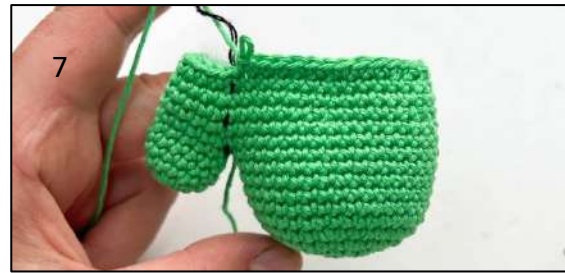
Rnd 14: sc around [48]

Rnd 15: (dec, 6 sc) x6, (fig 7) [42]

Rnd 16-17: sc around [42], **2 rounds**

Rnd 18: (dec, 5 sc) x6 [36]

Rnd 19-21: sc around [36], **3 rounds**



Close the hole between the thumb and glove using the remaining tail of the thumb (fig 8).



Change the yarn to white.

Rnd 22-23: sc around [36], **2 rounds**

Rnd 24: slst in each st [36]

• **Tip:** make a slip stitch loosely (fig 9).



Work only in front loops of previous round.

Rnd 25: FLO: slst in first front loop (fig 10), ch 1, in the same loop: sc, sc in next 35 stitches, join with slst in first st, (fig 11) [36]

Rnd 26-27: ch 1, 36 sc, slst in first st, (fig 12, 13) [36], **2 rounds**

Fasten off in the same way as the star.





Use the white thin thread, embroder the small showflakes (fig 14, 15, 16 and 17).

Loop: ch 14.

Cut the yarn, leave a tail for sewing.

Sew the loop on the right or on the left.

Add a little bit stuffing (fig 17).





BODY

Use the red yarn.

Make 2 pieces.

Rnd 1: 6 sc in magic ring [6]

Rnd 2: (inc) x6 [12]

Rnd 3: (inc, sc) x6 [18]

Rnd 4: sc around [18]

Rnd 5: (2 sc, inc) x6 [24]

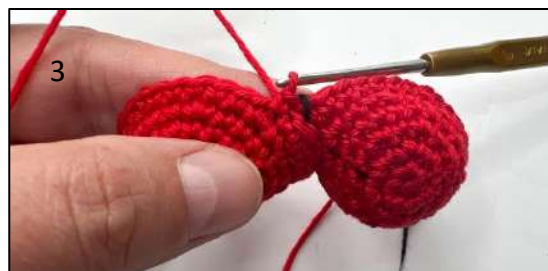
Rnd 6: (inc, 7 sc) x3 [27]

Cut the yarn of the first piece.

Don't cut the yarn of the second piece (fig 1). We are going to connect the two pieces together.



Insert your hook in the next stitch of first piece and crochet sc (fig 2, 3). It will be the first stitch of new round and new beginning. Put your stitch marker here.



Rnd 7: two pieces together: 27 sc around the first piece, 27 sc around the second, (fig 4) [54]

Close the hole between these two pieces using the remaining tail of the first piece (fig 5).



Rnd 8: 53 sc around, don't crochet the last stitch.

Put your stitch marker here. It will be the new beginning (fig 6).

Rnd 9: (dec, 7 sc) x6 [48]

Rnd 10-12: sc around, (fig 7) [48], **3 rounds**



Rnd 13: (dec, 6 sc) x6 [42]

Attach the white yarn.

Rnd 14: (white yarn: sc, red yarn: 3 sc) x10, white yarn: sc, red yarn: sc, (fig 8, 9) [42]



Rnd 15: red yarn: sc around [42]

Rnd 16: (white yarn: sc, red yarn: sc) x21 [42]

Cut the red yarn. Start to stuff the heart.

Rnd 17: (dec, 5 sc) x6, (fig 10) [36]

Rnd 18: sc around [36]

Rnd 19: (dec, 4 sc) x6 [30]

Rnd 20: sc around [30]

Stuff the heart firmly.

Rnd 21: (dec, 3 sc) x6 [24]

Rnd 22: sc around [24]

Rnd 23: (dec, 2 sc) x6 [18]

Rnd 24: sc around [18]

Rnd 25: (dec, sc) x6 [12]

Cut the yarn, leave a tail for closing.

How to close the end of the round: with a darning needle, insert the remaining yarn through all the front loops of the stitches on the last round (fig 11, 12). Pull all together at once and sew to hide the yarn inside the part you are working on.



Bring the remaining tail between two pieces to make the loop (fig 13).





BODY

Use the white yarn.

Rnd 1: 6 sc in magic ring [6]

Rnd 2: (inc) x6 [12]

Rnd 3: (inc, sc) x6 [18]

Rnd 4: (2 sc, inc) x6 [24]

Rnd 5: (inc, 3 sc) x6 [30]

Rnd 6: 2 sc, (inc, 4 sc) x5, inc, 2 sc [36]

Change the yarn to green.

Rnd 7-17: sc around, (fig 1) [36], **11 rounds**



Rnd 18: 24 sc, chain 12 (fig 2), then skip 12 stitches of the body (we leave it for the heel) and insert your hook in next stitch (fig 3) (it will be the first st of new round) [36]



Rnd 19: 24 sc, sc in next 12 chain stitches, (fig 4) [36]

Rnd 20-26: sc around, (fig 5) [36], **7 rounds**

Change the yarn to white.

Rnd 27-28: sc around [36], **2 rounds**

Rnd 29: slst in each stitch [36]

• **Tip:** make a slip stitch loosely, otherwise your your sock will be twisted (fig 6).



Work only in front loops of previous round.

Rnd 30: FLO: slst in first front loop (fig 7), ch 1, in the same loop: sc, sc in next 35 stitches, join with slsl in first st, (fig 8) [36]

Rnd 31: ch 1, 36 sc, join with slst in first st [36]

Rnd 32: ch 1, 36 sc, (fig 9) [36]

Fasten off in the same way as the star.



HEEL

Use the white yarn.

Lay the sock so that the lower part is facing you. Then, make one starting chain stitch. In the same stitch, crochet one single crochet and it will be the first stitch of first round (fig 10, 11).



Rnd 1: sc in next 12 stitches of body (fig 12), sc in next 12 chain loops, (fig 13) [24]

Rnd 2: 24 sc [24]

Rnd 3: (dec, 2 sc) x6 [18]

Rnd 4: (dec, sc) x6 [12]

Cut the yarn, leave a tail to fasten off.

Close the stitches of last round in the same way as the heart (fig 14).



Close a little hole between white and green stitches with starting tail.

Use the white thin thread, embroider the small snowflakes (fig 15, 16).

Loop: ch 14.

Cut the yarn, leave a tail for sewing.
Sew the loop on the right or on the left.
Stuff the sock lightly.



- **Tip:** to keep the drum in shape, we will crochet the top and the bottom with two pieces. Another way to do it is to crochet one piece and use a cardboard that you would glue to the crocheted piece.

BOTTOM (make 2) and TOP (make 2)

Use the red yarn.

Rnd 1: 6 sc in magic ring, join with slst [6]

Rnd 2: ch 1, (inc) x6, join with slst [12]

Rnd 3: ch 1, (inc, sc) x6, join with slst [18]

Rnd 4: ch 1, (2 sc, inc) x6, join with slst [24]

Rnd 5: ch 1, (inc, 3 sc) x6, join with slst [30]

Rnd 6: ch 1, 2 sc, (inc, 4 sc) x5, inc, 2 sc, join with slst [36]

Rnd 7: ch 1, 4 sc, (inc, 5 sc) x5, inc, sc, join with slst [42]

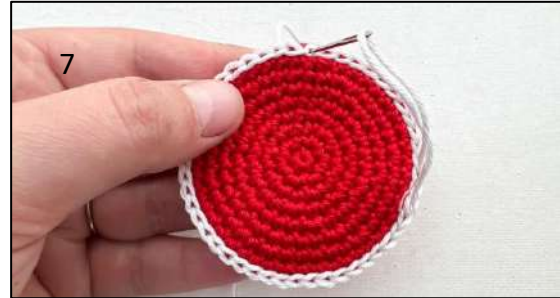
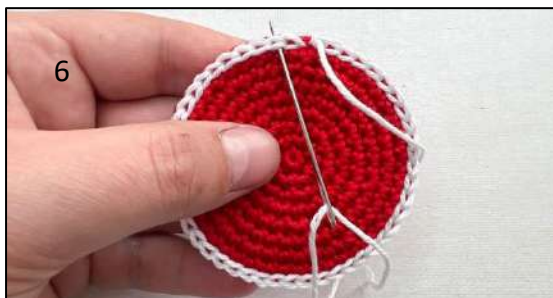
Rnd 8: ch 1, (6 sc, inc) x6 [48]

Fasten off (fig 1, 2 and 3).





Lay the two pieces together with the right side facing out (fig 4). Use the white yarn, insert your hook in the first stitches of two pieces and make a slip stitch (fig 5). Attached the two pieces with slip stitch in each stitch (fig 6 and 7).



BORDER (first type)

Use the brown(b) and white (w) yarn.

Insert your hook in the back loop and pick up the yarn (fig 8, 9). Crochet a starting chain, then make a single crochet in the same loop and it will be the first stitch of first round (fig 10).





Rnd 1: BLO: ch 1, 48 sc, join with slst in first st, (fig 11) [48]

Rnd 2: ch 1, (brown: 7 sc, white: sc) x6, join with slst in first st (make a slst with white yarn) [48]

Rnd 3: white yarn: ch 1, sc, brown: 5 sc, (white: 3 sc, brown: 5 sc) x5, white: 2 sc, slst in first st [48]

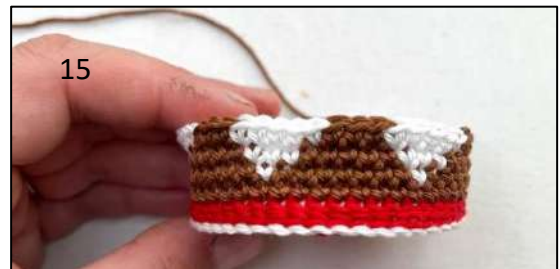
Rnd 4: white yarn: ch 1, 2 sc, brown: 3 sc, (white: 5 sc, brown: 3 sc) x5, white: 3 sc, slst in first st [48]

Rnd 5: white yarn: ch 1, 3 sc, brown: sc, (white: 7 sc, brown: sc) x5, white: 4 sc, slst in first st [48]

Cut the brown yarn.

Rnd 6: white yarn: ch 1, 48 sc [48]

Fasten off in the same way as the bottom pieces.



Make two pieces of the top by follow the pattern on the page 14.

Use the white yarn, insert your hook throught the stitches of two pieces of top and the back loop of the border (fig 16).

Pick up the yarn and pull it through (fig 17, 18).

Insert your hook again in next two stitches and back loop and make a slip stitch.

Connect the top with border loop to make a slip stitch in each stitch (fig 19, 20).

Stuff the drum lightly before to close all stitches.





Don't cut the white yarn after connected all stitches. Crochet 14 chains, then cut the yarn and sew the tail to the drum (fig 21. 22).



BORDER (second type)

Use the brown(b) and white (w) yarn.

Insert your hook in the back loop of previous round and pick up the yarn (fig 23). Crochet a starting chain, then make a single crochet in the same loop and it will be the first stitch of first round.



Rnd 1: BLO: white yarn: ch 1, (white yarn: sc, brown yarn: 5 sc) x8, change the yarn to white by doing the last stitch, join with slst in first st, (fig 24) [48]

Rnd 2: white yarn: ch 1, 2 sc, (brown yarn: 3 sc, white yarn: 3 sc) x7, brown yarn: 3 sc, white yarn: sc, slst in first st [48]

Rnd 3: white yarn: ch 1, 3 sc, (brown yarn: sc, white yarn: 5 sc) x7, brown yarn: sc, white yarn: 2 sc, slst in first st [48]

Rnd 4: white yarn: ch 1, 48 sc, slst in first st [48]

Rnd 5: white yarn: ch 1, 4 sc, (brown yarn: sc, white yarn: 5 sc) x7, brown yarn: sc, white yarn: sc, slst in first st [48]

Rnd 6: white yarn: ch 1, 3 sc, (brown yarn: 3 sc, white yarn: 3 sc) x7, brown yarn: 3 sc, slst in first st [48]

Rnd 7: brown yarn: ch 1, sc, (white yarn: sc, brown yarn: 5 sc) x7, white yarn: sc, brown yarn: 4 sc, (fig 26) [48]

Fasten off.

Find the pattern of the top part of the drum on the page 14, how to sew and close on the page 15 and 16 (fig 27, 28).



BOTTOM (make 2)

Use the red yarn and **two stitch markers different color** (my orange and purple).

Rnd 1: 6 sc in magic ring, join with slst [6]

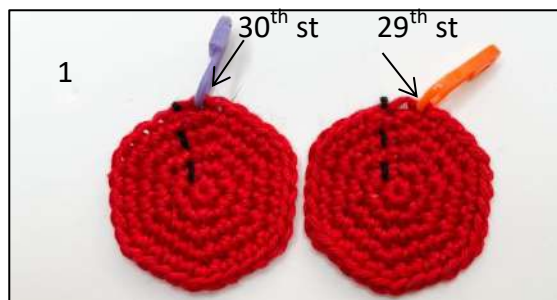
Rnd 2: ch 1, (inc) x6, join with slst [12]

Rnd 3: ch 1, (sc, inc) x6, join with slst [18]

Rnd 4: ch 1, (2 sc, inc) x6, join with slst [24]

Rnd 5: ch 1, (3 sc, inc) x6 [30]

Mark the last stitch (30th stitch of round 5) of the first piece with **purple stitch marker** and previous stitch (29th stitch of round 5) of the second piece with **orange stitch marker** (fig 1).



Lay the two pieces together so that the first piece with **purple stitch marker will be on the bottom** and the second with **orange will be on the top** (fig 2).

• **Tip:** There are two pieces of the bottom that have hexagonal shape (fig 1). tops of the hexagonal we will count our increases that we have made in each round. So, it's

very important to connect two pieces right and keep the hexagonal shape of bottom.



Now we are going to connect two pieces together. Insert your hook in the two marked stitches (fig 3), pick up the green yarn and pull it through (fig 4).

Connect two pieces together by making a slip stitch through the each stitch (fig 5, 6).



Fasten off.

Take out the purple stitch marker and **don't remove the orange.**

• **Tip:** the stitch with orange marker we will use as the starting stitch for the body.

BODY

Use the red (R) and white (W) yarn.

Insert your hook **in the back loop** of marked stitch (fig 7), pick up the red yarn and pull it through. Make a starting chain, then crochet a single crochet and it will be the first stitch of the body and new round.



Rnd 1: BLO: R: ch 1, sc in the same stitch, change the yarn to white, (W: 3 sc, R: sc, slst in next st, ch 1, sc in this stitch (stitch in which we have made a slip stitch)) x5, W: 3 sc, R: sc, slst in first st, (fig 9, 10) [30]

• I used black thread as stitch marker for the body.





Rnd 2: R: ch 1, sc, (W: sc, inc, sc, R: sc, slst in next st, ch 1, sc in this stitch) x5, W: sc, inc, sc, R: sc, slst in first st, (fig 10) [36]

Rnd 3-5: R: ch 1, sc, (W: 4 sc, R: sc, slst in next st, ch 1, sc in this stitch) x5, W: 4 sc, R: sc, slst in first st, (fig 11, 12) [36], **3 rounds**

Rnd 6: R: ch 1, sc, (W: 2 sc, inc, sc, R: sc, slst in next st, ch 1, sc in this stitch) x5, W: 2 sc, inc, sc, R: sc, slst in first st, (fig 13) [42]



Rnd 7-9: R: ch 1, sc, (W: 5 sc, R: sc, slst in next st, ch 1, sc in this stitch) x5, W: 5 sc, R: sc, slst in first st [42], **3 rounds**

Rnd 10: R: ch 1, sc, (W: 3 sc, inc, sc, R: sc, slst in next st, ch 1, sc in this stitch) x5, W: 3 sc, inc, sc, R: sc, slst in first st [48]

Rnd 11-12: R: ch 1, sc, (W: 6 sc, R: sc, slst in next st, ch 1, sc in this stitch) x5, W: 6 sc, R: sc, slst in first st [48], **2 rounds**

Rnd 13: R: ch 1, sc, (W: 4 sc, inc, sc, R: sc, slst in next st, ch 1, sc in this stitch) x5, W: 4 sc, inc, sc, R: sc, slst in first st [54]

Rnd 14: R: ch 1, sc, (W: 7 sc, R: sc, slst in next st, ch 1, sc in this stitch) x5, W: 7 sc, R: sc, slst in first st [54]

Rnd 15: R: ch 1, sc, (W: 7 sc, R: sc, slst in next st, ch 1, sc in this stitch) x5, W: 7 sc, R: sc (fig 13) [54]

Don't make a slip stitch.

Don't cut the **red yarn**, we are going to connect the body to the top part.

Stuff the body.



TOP (make 2)

Use the green yarn.

Rnd 1: 6 sc in magic ring, join with slst [6]

Rnd 2: ch 1, (inc) x6, join with slst [12]

Rnd 3: ch 1, (sc, inc) x6, join with slst [18]

Rnd 4: ch 1, (2 sc, inc) x6, join with slst [24]

Rnd 5: ch 1, (3 sc, inc) x6, join with slst [30]

Rnd 6: ch 1, (4 sc, inc) x6, join with slst [36]

Rnd 7: ch 1, (5 sc, inc) x6, join with slst [42]

Rnd 8: ch 1, (6 sc, inc) x6, join with slst [48]

Rnd 9: ch 1, (7 sc, inc) x6, join with slst [54]

Rnd 10: ch 1, (BLO: 8 sc, inc) x6 [60]

Mark the last stitch (60th stitch of round 10) of the first piece with purple stitch marker and previous stitch (59th stitch of round 10) of the second piece with orange stitch marker.

Lay the two pieces together so that the first piece with **purple stitch marker will be on the bottom** and the second with **orange will be on the top**. Then join two pieces together using the red yarn as the bottom part of the flashlight (fig 14).



Now we are going to connect the body to the top (fig 15).

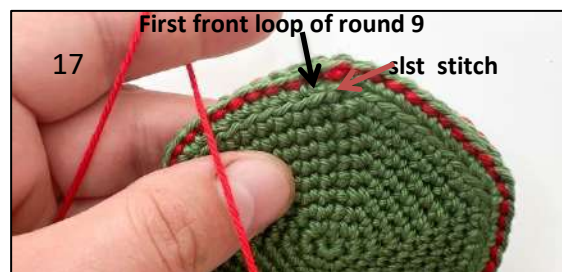


Use the red yarn of the body, insert the hook in next stitch of body (fig 16) and the **first front loop of the top** (fig 17).

• **Tip:** the first front loop lays after a slip stitch.

Make a slip stitch (fig 18) and do it loosely. Connect the body and top by making a slip stitch in each stitch of the body and the front loop of the top (fig 19, 20).

If you need, add the stuffing to the body as you join the body and the top.



Fasten off.

Cut the yarn, leave a long tail.

Embroider a big cross (cross-stitch) from top to bottom on the white pieces of body as show on photos 21, 22 and 23.



CAP

Use the red yarn.

Rnd 1: 6 sc in magic ring [6]

Rnd 2: (inc) x6 [12]

Rnd 3: (inc, sc) x6 [18]

Rnd 4: (2 sc, inc) x6 [24]

Rnd 5: (inc, 3 sc) x6 [30]

Rnd 6: 2 sc, (inc, 4 sc) x5, inc, 2 sc [36]

Rnd 7: sc around [36]

Rnd 8: 4 sc, (inc, 5 sc) x5, inc, sc [42]

Rnd 9: sc around [42]

Rnd 10: (6 sc, inc) x6 [48]

Rnd 11: (inc, 7 sc) x6, (fig 25) [54]

Don't cut the yarn. now we are going connect the cap to the top.

Use the red yarn of the cap, insert the hook in next stitch of the cap and the **first front loop of the top** (fig 26). Connect the cap to the top making a slip stitch in each stitch and front loop.

Make a slip stitch loosely, otherwise your cap will be twisted.

Embroider a little white lines one stitch length on the cap (fig 28).

At last, sew a little loop in the magic ring.





FRONT and BACK WALL

Use the light brown yarn.

Ch 11. Make sure, that your chains are not twisted.

Row 1: start in second chain from hook: inc in this chain, 9 sc, turn [11]

- **Tip:** don't make the starting chain.

Row 2: inc, 10 sc, turn [12]

Row 3: inc, 11 sc, turn [13]

Row 4: inc, 12 sc, turn [14]

Row 5: inc, 13 sc, turn [15]

Row 6: inc, 14 sc, turn [16]

Row 7: inc, 15 sc, turn [17]

Row 8-9: 17 sc, turn [17], **2 rows**

- **Tip:** don't use the invisible decrease. We will use the normal decreases (fig 1, 2).



Row 10: dec, 15 sc, turn [16]

Row 11: dec, 14 sc, turn [15]

Row 12: dec, 13 sc, turn [14]

Row 13: dec, 12 sc, turn [13]

Row 14: dec, 11 sc, turn [12]

Row 15: dec, 10 sc, turn [11]

Row 16: dec, 9 sc, turn [10]

Row 17: dec, 8 sc, turn [9]

Row 18: dec, 7 sc, turn [8]

Row 19: dec, 6 sc, turn [7]

Row 20: dec, 5 sc, turn [6]

Row 21: dec, 4 sc, turn [5]

Row 22: dec, 3 sc, turn [4]

Fasten off (fig 3).



DOOR (make 2)

Use the white yarn.

Ch 6.

Rnd 1: start in 3rd chain from hook: dc in this chain st, dc in next 2 chain st, 6 dc last ch, turn your crocheting and work on the other side: dc in next 3 st and ch 2 in last chain st [12]

Fasten off in the same as we have done the bottom pieces of flashlight (fig 4).

Leave a tail for sewing.



Decorate the door with the embroidery on back stitch using the blue thread (fig 5, 6).



WINDOW (make 2)

Use the blue yarn.

Rnd 1: 9 sc in magic ring.

Fasten off, leave a tail for sewing.



Sew the door and window to the wall using the bar (back) loops (fig 8, 9, 10).



Draw the outlines of the walls on the cardboard using the pencil. Then take a scissors, cut them 5 mm smaller than the crocheted walls (fig 12, 13). Stick the

cardboard walls on the back side of the crocheting walls.

BODY (top, roof, walls and bottom)

Use the light brown yarn.

• **Tip:** we are going to crochet the body as one long piece.

Top:

Ch 13.

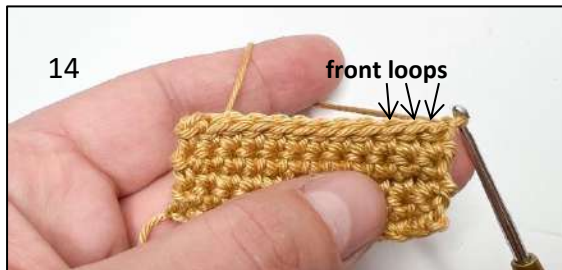
Row 1: start in second chain from hook: 12 sc, turn [12]

Row 2-5: 12 sc, turn [12], **4 rows**

Row 6: slip stitch in each stitch, turn [12]

Roof:

Row 7: ch 1, use only front loops: 12 sc, turn, (fig 14, 15, 16) [12]



Row 8-21: 12 sc, turn [12], **14 rows**

Row 22: slip stitch in each stitch, turn [12]

Right Wall:

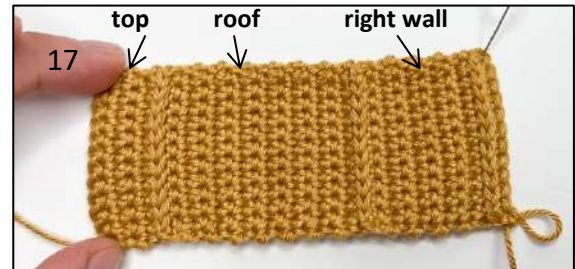
Row 23: ch 1, use only front loops: 12 sc, turn [12]

Row 24-31: 12 sc, turn [12], **8 rows**

Row 32: slip stitch in each stitch, turn [12]

Bottom:

Row 33: ch 1, use only front loops: 12 sc, turn, (fig 17) [12]



Row 34-43: 12 sc, turn [12], **10 rows**

Row 44: slip stitch in each stitch, turn [12]

Left wall:

Row 45: ch 1, use only front loops: 12 sc, turn, (fig 17) [12]

Row 46-53: 12 sc, turn [12], **8 rows**

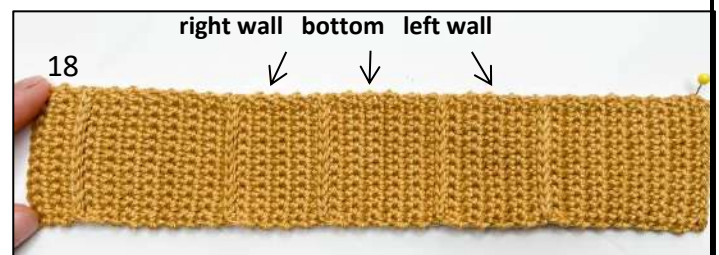
Row 54: slip stitch in each stitch, turn [12]

Roof:

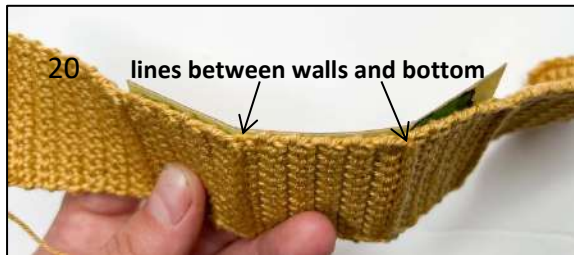
Row 55: ch 1, use only front loops: 12 sc, turn [12]

Row 56-69: 12 sc, turn, (fig 18) [12], **14 rows**

Cut the yarn, leave a long tail for sewing.



Cut the strip of the cardboard for the bottom part of house for right and left walls as show on photo (19). Fold the cardboard on the line of the walls and bottom (fig 20, 21) and stick it to the crocheting bottom and walls.



Sew the front wall to the body. You should sew the wall to the body bringing the needle by going from inside to outside (fig 24, 25, 26).

At last, sew the top part of body to the wall (fig 27).



Stuff the house and sew the back wall to the body (fig 28).



DECORATION (make 2)

Use the white yarn.

Ch 41.

Row 1: start in second chain from hook: 40 sc, turn [40]

Row 2: ch 1, (skip next st, 6 hdc in next st, skip next st, slst in next st) x10, (fig 29, 30).

You should have 10 shells.



Place the decoration wrong side around the sewing line from top of the roof, line between roof and wall and back to top of back side (fig 31, 32).



Sew and place the decoration along the line as show on photo 33 and 34.



ROOF (make 2)

Use the brown yarn.

Ch 18. Make sure that your chains are not twisted.

Row 1: start in second chain from hook: 17 sc [17]

Row 2: ch 1, 2 hdc, (shell, 3 hdc) x3, shell, 2 hdc, (fig 40), turn [17]

How to make a shell:

-Crochet 9 dc in one stitch (fig 35).

-Take out the hook from last stitch and insert in 1st dc (fig 36).

-Fold the shell (fig 37).

-Pick up the loop and pull it through the 1st stitch (fig 38, 39).

-Make 1 chain

Row 3: ch 1, 17 sc, turn [17]

Row 4: ch 1, 4 hdc, (shell, 3 hdc) x2, shell, 4 hdc, (fig 41) [17]

Row 5: ch 1, 17 sc, turn [17]

Row 6: ch 1, 2 hdc, (shell, 3 hdc) x3, shell, 2 hdc, turn [17]

Row 7: ch 1, 17 sc, turn [17]

Row 8: ch 1, 4 hdc, (shell, 3 hdc) x2, shell, 4 hdc [17]

Row 9: ch 1, 17 sc, turn [17]

Row 10: ch 1, 2 hdc, (shell, 3 hdc) x3, shell, 2 hdc, turn [17]

Row 11: ch 1, 17 sc, turn [17]

Row 12: ch 1, 4 hdc, (shell, 3 hdc) x2, shell, 4 hdc [17]

Row 13: ch 1, 17 sc, turn [17]

Row 14: ch 1, 2 hdc, (shell, 3 hdc) x3, shell, 2 hdc, turn, (fig 42) [17]

Cut the yarn, leave a tail for sewing.



Sew the two pieces together (fig 43).



Place the roof on the house (fig 44, 45). You should sew it to the decoration (fig 46).



BEARD (make: 8 blue and 4 pink)

Rnd 1: 6 sc in magic ring [6]

Rnd 2: (sc, inc) x3 [9]

Rnd 3: sc around [9]

Fasten off. Leave a tail for sewing.

Place and sew the beards between the shells as show on photo (fig 47).

STRIPE

Use the white yarn.

Rnd 1: 6 sc in magic ring [6]

Rnd 2-16: sc around [6], **16 rounds**

Fasten off.

Sew the stripe on top of the house (fig 48).
